During calendar year 1990 the Department of Human Services received 17,013 referrals seeking Child Protective Services intervention in a family situation. Many of these referrals presented situations with evidence of serious family problems or dysfunction but did not contain allegations of child abuse or neglect. Title 22 MRSA, Chapter 1071, Subsection 4002 defines abuse or neglect as "a threat to a child's health or welfare by physical, mental or emotional injury or impairment, sexual abuse or exploitation, deprivation of essential needs or lack of protection from these by a person responsible for the child."

The Department's ability to respond to referrals of child abuse or neglect is based on factors such as the number of caseworkers, the seriousness or complexity of the cases receiving services and the availability of resources. Some referrals of abuse or neglect are not assigned to a caseworker for assessment due primarily to insufficient staff time being available.

The following report provides a summary of the number of referrals to Child Protective Services, the number of cases screened out by category and a series of detailed reports on the characteristics of the referrals which were assigned to caseworkers for assessment.

Screen Out Categories

A Referral is any written or verbal request for Child Protective Services intervention in a family situation on behalf of a child in order to assess or resolve problems being presented.

Reason for Screening Out Referral:

- 1591 Parent/child conflict: Children and parents in conflict over family/school/friends/behaviors with no serious allegations of abuse or neglect. Includes adolescents who are runaways or who are exhibiting acting out behaviors that parents have been unable to control.
- 4300 Non specific allegations or allegations of marginal physical/emotional care which is not considered serious enough for CPS intervention.
- 1043 Conflicts over custody of children which may include allegations of marginal/poor care which is not considered serious enough for CPS intervention.
- 1712 Families in crisis due to financial, physical, mental health, or interpersonal problems where there are no specific allegations of abuse or neglect.
- 3331 Other: This category is a catch all for a variety of other kinds of cases where individual categories would be numerous and the numbers within these categories would be relatively small.
- 920 Insufficient staff: The allegations would normally warrant Child Protective Services intervention but are not assigned because the office has reached the upper limits of its capacity to investigate and assess. These cases may be less serious, receiving services from other social services agencies, or considered to be at low risk of continued maltreatment.
