Re: PL 2023, c. 458, "An Act to Improve the Health of Maine Residents by Closing Coverage Gaps in the MaineCare Program for Incarcerated Persons."

Senator Baldacci, Representative Meyer, and members of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services:

Please allow this correspondence to serve as the interim report required by PL 2023, c. 458, "An Act to Improve the Health of Maine Residents by Closing Coverage Gaps in the MaineCare Program for Incarcerated Persons." This act amended 22 M.R.S. § 3174-CC, in part, by requiring the Department to enter into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with county and regional jails so that assistance can be provided to incarcerated persons applying for benefits.

The Department's Office for Family Independence (OFI) started its outreach process for this effort with the Maine Sheriffs' Association (MSA) in August 2023. In November 2023, OFI shared a draft of the MOU with MSA which has been an integral part in furthering the objectives of the bill. In December 2023 the Department submitted the MOU to all jails (in collaboration with MSA) and requested any additional questions, comments, or feedback. As of today, the Department has obtained eight (8) signed MOUs, has seven (7) MOUs awaiting final signature, and is continuing discussions with all seven (7) facilities/counties.

An additional measure included in PL 2023, c. 458, Section 3 requires the Department to apply to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services for a waiver pursuant to Section 1115 of the United States Social Security Act to provide reimbursement for services that can be provided under the MaineCare program to individuals who are incarcerated and that facilitate an individual's transition back into the community during at least the 90-day period prior to the release of an individual from incarceration in a correctional, facility, county jail or regional jail. The Department's Office of MaineCare Services (OMS) is leading this effort and OFI is actively collaborating to support this important project.
