Dear Senator Simpson, Representative Beaudette and Members of the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local Government,

Pursuant to 5 MRSA §12009, sub-§2, enclosed is the annual report which contains a summary of the activities and the expenses of boards and commissions in 2008. This report covers 264 entities in the statutory list of boards and commissions found in Title 5, Chapter 379.

During the Second Regular Session of the 123<sup>rd</sup> Legislature, our office worked with your Committee to implement changes to the information that boards and commissions were to report annually. These changes included an estimate of the number of hours the clerk of the board spent supporting the board or commission; a brief summary of the board or commission's activities related to accomplishing its mission; and the expenses and funding source or sources for all expenses paid for the functioning of the board, including reimbursement to members.

The break down of member expenses are per diem, travel related expenses and other expenses like stipends. The break down of board expenses are facility rental costs, refreshment costs, public hearing costs and other costs not included in the three other board expense categories.

The total cost, reported to date, in 2008 for all expenses for all funding sources is \$1,271,270.40. On the final page of the attached report, we have provided a breakdown by expense categories and for each funding source as well as grand totals of expenses by funding source.

Attached to this letter, I have included separate reports for those boards and commissions which:

- 1. Filed an annual report for 2008 indicating activity in 2008 (white section) and include the changes in reporting requirements as referenced above;
- 2. Filed an annual report for 2008 indicating inactivity or no meeting of the board or commission in 2008 (blue section); and
- 3. Did not file an annual report for 2008 (green section).
