Summary of the activities related to accomplishing the mission of the board in 2017: During the course of the year the SERC heard from a number of LEPC's on the status of local planning and response capabilities.

The SERC through MEMA staff monitors over 2,500 chemical facilities that may pose a threat to public safety. Of this number about 285 facilities are required to develop plans that are reviewed on an annual basis.

Through fees collected SERC has provided hazmat training to over 1,500 first responders. This includes the normal hazardous materials training such as awareness, operations and technician and this year concentrating on providing ammonia, rescue and cold weather decon response training to first responders.

Highlights of the past year include continued implementation of a voluntary review program for Ammonia facilities, and review /inspect the 15 funded hazardous materials response teams to ensure they are fully capable of responding safely.
