Pursuant to 5 MRSA §12009, sub-§2, enclosed is the annual report which contains a summary of the activities and the expenses of boards and commissions in 2023 (report 1). This report covers the statutory list of boards and commissions found in Title 5, Chapter 379.

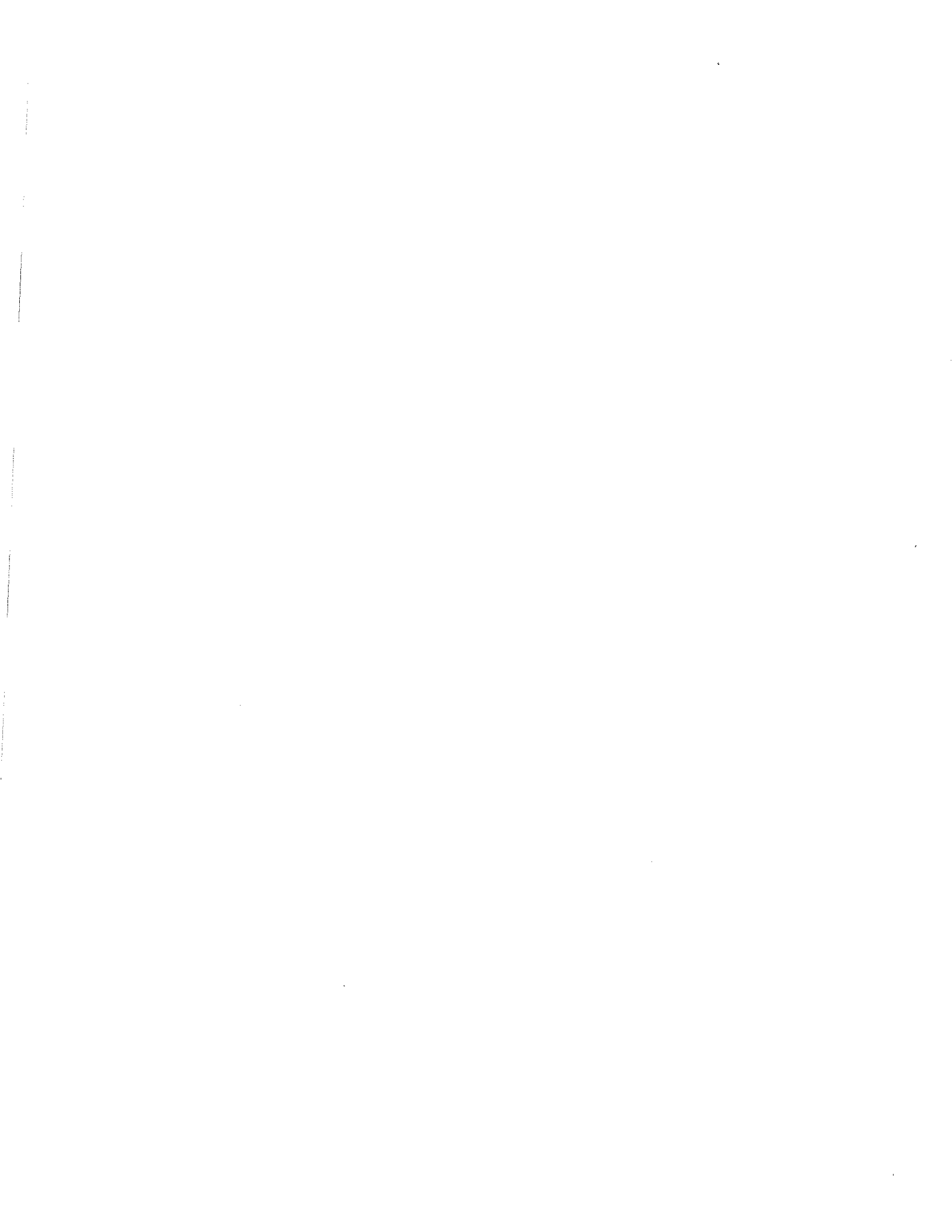
