In accordance with the provisions of the Revised Statutes, the report of the Maine State Retirement System for the biennium ended June 30, 1954 is hereby submitted.

In view of the intensive study and review of the Maine State Retirement System and other related subjects that have been conducted by the Recess Study Committee created by the Legislature under the provisions of Chapter 82 of the Resolves of 1953 and the resulting detailed and exhaustive report to that Committee made by the consulting firm of Bowles, Andrews and Towne and the subsequent report of the Recess Committee, both of which have been submitted to the 97th Legislature, the following report of the activites of the Maine State Retirement System for the biennium ended June 30, 1954 is confined primarily to financial and statistical data.

The Maine State Retirement System as such was created by act of the Legislature at a special session held early in 1942 and became operative as of July 1 that year. The original act provided for retirement coverage for all State employees and employees of such political subdivisions of the State as might elect to affiliate with the State System.

In 1947 a general revision of the law was enacted by the Legislature, at which time all public school teachers were included under the general State retirement plan.

In 1951 the Legislature enacted Chapter 395 of the Public Laws of that year under the provisions of which the State Retirement System was named as the State Agency through the medium of which political subdivisions of the State might secure Social Security coverage for the employees of such governmental units under such conditions as the Federal Social Security Act and the State Enabling Act imposed.

Up to the present time there are approximately 240 reporting units under the Social Security Program and it is anticipated that during the next biennium a substantial number of other political subdivisions of the State will take steps to cover their employees under this Program.

There are at the present time 43 Participating Local Districts operating under the provisions of the Maine State Retirement System including towns, cities, counties and certain other quasi-municipal agencies, and we are including in this report certain financial and statistical data with respect to these Districts as well as the employee and teacher groups.

To anyone interested in further detail with respect to the operations of the Maine State Retirement System we would refer them to the printed report of the consulting firm of Bowles, Andrews and Towne as submitted to the Legislative Recess Committee on the Maine State Retirement System and the report of the Recess Committee as submitted to the 97th Legislature.

The above calculations do not include the additional annual cost resulting from the increase in teachers minimums by the Legislature in September 1954.

Interest Deficit

Valuations are made on a 3% interest basis. Interest is declared at 3% which leaves a deficit if the Trust Funds do not earn 3%. During the last biennium the Trust Funds did not earn 3% although for the fiscal year 1954 the earned rate was very close to 3%. It is hoped that the Trust Funds will earn at least 3% during the 1954 fiscal year.
