REPORT OF THE MAINE STATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM

FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDED JUNE 30, 1972

In accordance with the provisions of Maine Revised Statutes, Annotated, the report of the Maine State Retirement System for the biennium ended June 30, 1972 is hereby submitted.

The Maine State Retirement System Law was enacted by the Legislature in 1947 and became effective as of July 1 that year. The System is administered by a Board of Trustees--seven in number: three members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council; one member elected by the Maine Teachers Association; one member elected by the Maine State Employees Association; one member appointed by the governing body of the Maine Municipal Association; one member who is a recipient of a retirement allowance through the Maine State Retirement System selected by the foregoing members of the Board.

As this is a part-time Board, the actual administration is conducted by the Executive Director and his staff. A Consulting Actuary is employed, under the provisions of the law, whose duty it is to make all computations of benefits provided for under the law and to determine what appropriation requests shall be made of the Legislature to maintain the System in a solvent position. A Medical Board consisting of three non-members is also provided for under the law. One of the duties of this Board is to determine the validity of disability and service incurred disability claims.

In addition to administering the basic Retirement Law, the department is also charged with administering the Group Life Insurance Plan, the Survivor Benefit Plan, Retirement Allowance Adjustments, and the Federal Social Security Plan as it applies to political subdivisions.

At its inception the Retirement System covered State employees and employees of such political subdivisions as might elect to join the System. As a result of amendments to the law the coverage is now extended to all public school teachers and the growth in the membership has reached a point where more than 48,000 open accounts are handled.

Legislation has provided for management and custody of the System's investments by fiduciaries within a general investment policy of the Board of Trustees.

As a result of this legislation the Board entered into agreements with the First National Bank of Boston - Old Colony Trust Company for the custody of all investments belonging to the Maine State Retirement System. In addition, the Board entered into agreements with the Alliance Capital Management Corp., Putnam Advisory Company, Inc., and Standard and Poor's Counseling Corp. for the management of the investments. As of the close of the last fiscal year the total assets of the System were valued at \$185,160,079.00.

The funds of the System are invested in bonds, mortgages, and equities. A detail of such investments is available upon request.

The current retirement payrolls approximate \$30,000,000.00 annually, and the average monthly benefit paid to retired State employees as of the end of June 1972 was \$228.12, and to teachers \$273.88.

The number of retired persons receiving benefits as of that date was 9,321.

Benefits paid under the Survivor Benefit plan were \$922,512.90 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1972.

The function of this department with respect to the Social Security Program is as an agent to enter into Agreements with political subdivisions of the State of Maine and the collection of FICA taxes. We are presently under agreement for this purpose with some 572 reporting units consisting of counties, cities, towns and other quasi-municipal agencies. The benefit side of the program is handled entirely by the Social Security Administration.

The cost of administering the Social Security Program is prorated to and collected from the units under contract.

Tabulations and schedules included in this Report reflect the financial status of the System and offer information which we trust will be of interest to all participants in the various programs administered by this department, as well as to the Legislature and the general public.

The following benefit improvements have been provided under the System during the past biennium, as a result of legislation and action by the Board of Trustees:

Credit for teachers service prior to July 1, 1947 changed from 1/70th to 1/60th in benefit computation. Retired teachers given 16 2/3% increase in benefit for service rendered prior to July 1, 1947.

Benefit for forest rangers changed to 1/2 current annual salary after 25 years service and attained age 50.

Benefit for law enforcement officers of Inland Fisheries and Game and Sea and Shore Fisheries Departments changed to 1/2 current annual salary for 20 years service.

Remarriage restriction for Survivor Benefit recipients removed after age 60.

Benefit for liquor inspectors changed to 1/2 current final compensation from 1/2 average final compensation.

ACTUARIAL REPORT

The valuation this year was based on an estimated annual payroll of \$71, 388, 044 for State employees and \$125, 256, 747 for MTRA Teachers.

Section 1095 in the next to the last paragraph states in part as follows:

"At no time shall the state matching share of the cost of the retirement system be increased due to change in formula . . . " " . . . Any additional costs are to be borne by the members . . . "

In view of the above and the uncertainty of substantial increases in the future investment yields, it is recommended that the member's rate of contribution be changed from 5.0% to 5.7%.

Five years have passed since the present actuarial assumptions for mortality, morbidity termination, and other service tables were adopted. In accordance with Section 1001, Subsection 13, these assumptions should be tested in 1973.

There are very few active members left in the Old Teachers System, by the end of the next biennium they should all be in a retired status. It is suggested that a study be made of ways to liquidate this entire liability over a period of years.

The Survivor Benefit payment of .25% of estimated payroll for Teachers should be continued, however, for State employees this percentage rate should be increased to .79% of estimated payroll due to the increase in State employee Survivor Benefit payments.

The Unfunded Liability for State employees is \$110, 692, 578 and for MTRA Teachers \$152, 128, 780.

The present Normal Contribution rate of 3.79% of estimated payroll should be continued for each year of the next biennium.

The Accrued Liability Contribution rate for fiscal 1973-74 should be 5.03% and 5.18% for fiscal 1974-75.

The attached exhibit shows additional charges for special provisions of the law.

During the year valuation reports were prepared for 141 Participating Local Districts. In addition, 36 initial valuations were prepared and the costs under special provisions of the law were developed for 25 districts.

Paid Claims

During the 12 month period, actual paid claims were \$1,157,040.00.

Conversion Charges

During the 12 month period, employees and teachers converted \$133,500 of insurance. The charge at \$75/1000 amounted to \$10,012.50.

Disability Claims

During the 12 month period, 15 employees with insurance retired on disability and were still alive on June 30, 1972. During the same period, waiver of premium was approved for 3 people not retired on disability. The total amount of insurance for this group was \$143,000.00. At \$600 per 1000, the disability reserve charge was \$85,800.00.

Disability Recoveries

During the 12 month period, there were no disability recoveries.

Disabled Deaths

During the 12 month period 2 disabled people died with \$10,000.00 of insurance. This released reserves of \$6,000.00.

Reduction in Disability Claims

During the 12 month period, the amount of insurance on 35 disability claimants was reduced by \$79,075.00. This releases reserves of \$47,445.00.
