THE LEGISLATURE

SIZE

The Senate has 33 members. The House has 151 members. For this century, a majority of members of the Senate have been of the Republican party (excepting for the 75th, the 102nd and this Legislature.) The present Senate has 23 Democrats and 10 Republicans. The House had a Democratic majority in the 102nd Legislature. The 103rd House through the 106th House had a majority of Republicans. The 107th, 108th, 109th and 110th had a majority of Democrats. There are 92 Democrats and 59 Republicans in the House of the 111th Legislature.

REPRESENTATION

Each senator represents a district including approximately 33,000 constituents. Each House member represents a district which has approximately 6,500 members. Originally senators were elected at large from each county with numbers according to population; since the 104th Legislature they have been elected by district. Until the 109th Legislature, House members from some of the larger communities in the state were elected at large from their districts. Now there are subdistricts in those larger communities. Some Senate districts cross county lines and town and city lines. Some House districts do likewise.

ELECTION OF LEGISLATIVE LEADERSHIP

The Senate and House each elects its presiding officer. The Majority Leaders and Assistants are chosen by the members of the respective majority and minority parties in each branch. The Senate elects its own Secretary and the House elects its own Clerk. The President of the Senate is Gerard P. Conley. Speaker of the House is John L. Martin. Charles P. Pray is Majority Leader in the Senate; his Assistant is Michael E. Carpenter. Minority Leader in the Senate is Samuel W. Collins, Jr. The Assistant Minority Leader is Barbara A. Gill. House Majority Leader is Elizabeth H. Mitchell; Assistant Majority Leader is John N. Diamond. Minority Leader in the House is Linwood M. Higgins and the Assistant Minority Leader is Leland C. Davis, Jr. Secretary of the Senate is Joy J.O'Brien; Assistant Secretary is Valerie Mitchell; Clerk of the House is Edwin H. Pert.

The Senate and the House jointly elect the constitutional officers, who include Secretary of State, the Attorney General, and the Treasurer, all elected to a two-year term. They also jointly elect the State Auditor, for a four-year term. Usually the constitutional officers are members of the Majority party in the total Legislature. Rodney S. Quinn was elected Secretary of State. The Attorney General is James E. Tierney. The Treasurer is Samuel D. Shapiro. Auditor is George J. Rainville, whose term expires in 1985.

STAFF

The Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House recommend appointments to their staffs to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House. The House maintains a staff of about 30 persons when the Legislature is in session. The Senate maintains a staff of close to 30 when it is in session. The Secretary and Clerk serve on a permanent basis, reducing their staffs when the Legislature is not in session.

Both the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House are entitled to employ a secretary, one aide and a counsel. The Majority and Minority Leaders are authorized by statutes to have partisan aides and a secretary. The Majority Leaders have aides and a secretary. The Minority Leaders have one aide and a secretary year round.

SEAT ASSIGNMENTS

Seats in the Senate are assigned by the Majority Leader with returning Senators having priority, then new members of the majority and then the minority.

Seats in the House are assigned on the basis of seniority. Requests from legislators are taken into consideration when making assignments.

COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS

Legislative committees generally have 13 members, 10 from the House and three from the Senate each. The President and Speaker make the appointments, asking for recommendations of the Majority and Minority Leaders.

COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES

Joint standing legislative committees meet when there are bills available for which they may hold public hearing and which they may discuss. Bills may be filed for up to 45 days prior to the beginning of each legislative session. The Senate committee chairmen schedule the meetings with the agreement of the House chairmen and with the concurrence of the committees. A clerk to each committee is hired by agreement between the Senate and the House chairmen.

COMMITTEE POWERS

Each committee has the power to schedule public hearings on all bills, to study legislation referred to it by the Legislature, and subject to legislative and legislative council approval, to study problems both during the session and between sessions. In addition to holding hearings on bills, committees may amend bills and they may redraft bills. They vote bills out of committee ought to pass, ought not to pass, ought to pass as amended, or ought to pass in new draft. Bills voted out of committee unanimously ought not to pass are not considered by the House and Senate. Dissent by one committee member from an ought not to pass may force legislative discussion on

any document. Bills may also be reported out in divided form, with some members favoring the legislation and some not favoring it or favoring it in different form. Divided reports usually mean that the bill is debated on the floor of each body.

COMMITTEE WORKLOADS

The number of bills assigned to committees varies, with some committees hearing close to 200 bills in the course of the sessions. In the 109th Legislature for example, the Joint Standing Committee on State Government heard 149 bills; the Judiciary, 234; the Business Legislation Committee, 176; the Taxation Committee, 210; and the Education Committee, 102. Added together, all the bills in the first regular session of each Legislature can number 2,000 or more.

LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The first regular session is limited by statute to 100 days and the second session, 50 days. The Legislature may vote short extensions of these deadlines when necessary. With all possible extensions, the Legislature could meet up to 111 days during its first regular session and up to 61 days in its next session. It can meet in special session on the call of the Governor. It can also call itself into session with the consent of the majority of each political party, all having been polled.

LEGISLATIVE PAY

Legislators are paid \$6,500 for their first session and \$3,500 for their second session, receiving a pay check every other week. In addition, they receive per diem expenses of up to \$45—up to \$21 for meals and up to \$24 for mileage in lieu of lodging. The President of the Senate and Speaker of the House each receive 50% more salary than their colleagues. The Majority and Minority Leaders each receive 25% more salary than their colleagues and the Assistant Majority and Assistant Minority Leaders receive 12½% more salary.

Legislators receive \$200 for constituent services. When called into special session, they are paid \$25 for each day, plus expense allowances similar to those which they receive during the regular session. The same financial arrangements apply if legislative committees meet when the legislature is not in session.

LEGISLATIVE FACILITIES

The Senate and House each have retiring rooms. The Senate retiring room is on the fourth floor. The House has a retiring room on the third floor and lockers on the first floor. There is also a women's legislative lounge on the fourth floor with kitchen facilities. Women members of both the House and Senate share the Women's Legislative Lounge.

OTHER LEGISLATIVE PRIVILEGES

Each legislator may use the state telephone system whether in Augusta or not. There is an incoming WATS line on which legislators may call. Postage is available in reasonable amounts for the mailing of reports and documents. Legislators who use legislative license plates may park in reserved areas. These reserved plates cost each legislator \$2.00; legislators must pay excise and registration fees. While on route to the Legislature or from the Legislature to their homes, legislators may not be detained by law officers; they can, however, be cited to appear in court at a later time.

There is a legislative post office, where legislators receive their mail daily. Senator's mail is delivered to their desks; House members pick theirs up at the boxes.

The master address for writing to Senate and House members is State House Station, Augusta, Maine 04333. First class mail is forwarded by the Clerk of the House and Senate Secretary to members when the Legislature is not in session, or when a Legislator is absent for a particular reason.

There is also a Legislative message Center, where phone messages may be received. The Senate number is 289-3601; the House number is 289-2866. When the Legislature is in session there is a toll-free incoming number—1-800-452-4601.

LEGISLATIVE SUPPORT SERVICES

There are other legislative support services. The Legislative Research Office assists legislators in drafting legislation and prepares their bills in final form.

Legislative assistants are assigned to each committee, to do research for the committee and to draft amendments or redrafts of bills, or new bills ordered by the committee.

An excellent Law Library on the second floor of the State House is available to all legislators and to the public. It contains a great deal of reference material for use in drafting bills or preparing reports or speeches.

Legislators may call on state department heads for information and special assistance. The Chancellor of the University of Maine is included in this category. Additionally, senators and representatives can call on the office of the Clerk of the House and office of the Secretary of the Senate for special assistance.

The Governor maintains a liaison staff which can work with legislators and arrange appointments with the Governor as necessary.

RULES

The Senate and the House each establishes its own rules. Usually this

means adopting the rules of the previous Legislature with some modifications. There are also joint rules which apply to both sides. It is useful to members to be reasonably familiar with the rules, as it facilitates effectiveness in debate and in voting procedures. Any member not familiar with a particular rule may ask the chair (President or Speaker) a procedural question about it.

VOTING

Most votes require no effort, as a great deal of legislation does not require debate and can be enacted or 'killed' under the gavel of the President or Speaker. Any senator or representative may request a 'division', which means a vote if he does not wish to see the legislation enacted or denied under the gavel. Legislators also have the right to request a roll call on record. To have a roll call vote requires approval by 1/5 of those present and voting in either body.

First action of either body usually consists of hearing a committee report on a piece of legislation. Bills are in their most amendable form after their second reading, although they can be amended at other times. Final step in the voting process is enactment, which means the bill has been printed and prepared for the signature of the Speaker of the House, the President of the Senate, and the Governor.

When the Senate and the House disagree sharply on a bill, a Committee of Conference can be sought. It would contain three persons each from the Senate and the House. The Committee of Conference usually then amends the bill and it is presented in its amended form to both bodies. It may not be further amended.

Maine is one of three states which has joint standing committees, consisting of members from the Senate and from the House. Most other states have separate Senate and House committees, which can lengthen and complicate the Legislative process.

TOOLS

The Senate and the House each prepares its own calendar daily which is available at 8:00 each morning, so that legislators may know what items of legislation will be acted upon that day. A schedule of committee hearings is put out weekly by the office of the Senate President.

A weekly legislative report is issued by the Clerk of the House when the legislature is in session; it lists every bill introduced in either branch. A weekly legislative calendar is issued by the Clerk of the House when the legislature is not in session.

Legislative Council conducts routine business of the Legislature when the Legislature is not in session, but does not enact legislation. The Legislative Council includes the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House, the Majority and Minority Leaders and the Assistant Majority and Minority Leaders in each body, and totals 10 in number.
