OVERVIEW OF THE COMMISSION

PURPOSE: The Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices is an independent citizens' body established for the purpose of guarding against corruption or undue influencing of the election process and against acts or the appearance of misconduct by Legislators.

MEMBERS: The Commission is comprised of nine members. Eight are appointed by members of the Legislature and the ninth, who is the Chair, is elected by members of the Commission. Members of the Commission must be persons of recognized judgment, probity and objectivity. While serving on the Commission, members are prohibited from holding elective county, state or federal office or serving as an officer of a political committee, party committee or political action committee. A person may not be appointed to the Commission who is a member of the Legislature or a member of the previous Legislature, or who was a declared candidate for an elective county, state or federal office within 2 years prior to the appointment.

RESPONSIBILITIES/MEETINGS: The function of the Commission is to administer the laws on campaign reports and finances, lobbyist disclosure, legislative ethics, and legislative financial disclosure. The Commission's duties include receiving and investigating complaints, determining the timeliness of reports, and issuing advisory opinions and recommendations in response to inquiries. The Commission met six times during calendar year 1994 and seven times in 1995. Members receive no compensation for their services.

THE STAFF: The staff of the Commission conducts the daily business of the agency. A director serves as spokesperson and liaison between the Legislature and the Commission, conducts Commission correspondence, makes findings and recommendations, tracks legislation, prepares fiscal notes, conducts preliminary investigations, drafts legislation, and prepares and edits Commission publications.

A lobbyist registrar processes the registrations of lobbyists and political action committees (PAC), prepares lobbyist and PAC registers, compiles and prepares statistics, and advises lobbyists and others with regard to the provisions of the lobbyist and PAC laws.

An elections agent processes registrations and reports, assists candidates and others in completing reports, advises candidates as to their legal obligations, prepares agenda materials, monitors filings, audits reports, and prepares statistics.

Although the Commission is empowered to investigate violations of the laws on campaign financing and legislative ethics, it has no investigative staff. Thus it relies largely on the Attorney General for assistance in this area.

ASSISTANCE: Under 1 M.R.S.A. Section 1006, the Commission may call for the assistance in the performance of its duties on the Attorney General, Secretary of State, Department of Audit or any law enforcement agency in this state. The Secretary of State maintains the Commission's financial and payroll records, and provides the Commission with advice concerning its computer systems; the Attorney General's Office provides legal advice; and the State Auditor assists the staff in preparing statistics and in conducting report audits. The important support provided by these agencies is very much appreciated by the Commission for it allows the small Commission staff to concentrate on its primary mission.

RECORDS: The staff devotes considerable time to creating, organizing, and maintaining records for public inspection. The following records are made available for public review: campaign finance reports of county, state, and gubernatorial candidates; candidates for Federal office; party committees; and political action committees. Also on file are lobbyist disclosure reports, financial disclosure statements of federal officials and members of the Legislature, minutes of Commission meetings, and advisory opinions. Reports filed with the Commission may be copied for a modest fee.

OFFICE LOCATION: During 1995, the Commission moved to Room 114 of the State Office Building in Augusta. The new quarters permit more efficient use of space and contain an expanded report review area as well as much needed storage space.

CAMPAIGN REPORTS AND FINANCES LAW

The campaign finance laws require candidates for state, county, gubernatorial, and federal office and political action committees organized within the State to register and to report their campaign contributions and expenditures to the Commission. Out-of-state political action committees making contributions to Maine candidates are subject to the reporting laws as well.

ACTIVITY DURING 1994-1995

Registrations: The election year was an especially busy one for the Commission. During the year, the staff processed the registrations of 661 state, county, gubernatorial, and congressional candidates. Open seats in both Congressional Districts and in the office of U.S. Senate and Governor drew an unusually large number of registrants, with a total of 20 individuals seeking election to Congress and 21 vying for the office of Governor.

Educational and Informational Activities: Throughout the election year, the staff communicated regularly with state and county candidates and political action committees, advising them of their legal obligations. In April, general reporting instructions were mailed, together with standardized forms, filing schedules, and other useful information. Prior to each filing date, reminders were mailed. In all, approximately 4700 election year notices went out to candidates, treasurers and committees during 1994.

Educational/Informational Activities (continued):

A substantial part of the staff's daily workload involves advising candidates and treasurers on how to complete reports and providing informal advice regarding the requirements of the law. Assistance is provided both in person and by phone. Other persons routinely advised by the staff include legislative staffers, members of the general public, students, scholars, and reporters, to name a few. At peak times, the small Commission staff handles up to 50 inquiries a day. To ensure the integrity of the advice provided, staff members confer with the Commission or with the Attorney General on questions of law that are subject to interpretation and where no prior ruling exists. The staff is also active in assisting persons inspecting various reports filed with the Commission.

The Commission staff collaborates with the Secretary of State to produce a candidate "guide" to understanding the reporting laws. The pamphlet details the requirements of Maine's election laws and "walks" the candidate through the entire reporting process. During the election year, approximately 600 copies of the pamphlet were distributed to candidates, treasurers, and others.

Another aspect of the Commission's information program involves the distribution of the laws administered by the Commission, and lists of political action committees, lobbyists, candidates, and treasurers.

Enforcement Activity: The monitoring of reports is a key element of the Commission's election year program. Although the staff lacks the resources to conduct in-depth compliance audits, it carefully reviews each registration and report for timeliness and accuracy. Following that review, each person who files a late report is notified of the violation and potential penalty; and advised of his or her right to a hearing before the full Commission.

During Calendar Year 1994, the Commission ruled on the late filings of 34 candidates, 14 political action committees, 7 party committees, and 29 lobbyists. The disposition of these cases was as follows:

During the Calendar Year 1995, the Commission ruled on the late filings of 53 candidates, 8 political action committees, 15 party committees and 26 lobbyists. The disposition of these cases was as follows:

Complaints: A person may apply in writing to the Commission requesting an investigation concerning the registration or report of a candidate, treasurer, political committee or political action committee. Each such request is acknowledged and subsequently pursued if the nature of the claim is relevant to the Commission's jurisdiction, and the reasons stated for the request show sufficient grounds for believing a violation may have occurred. A preliminary investigation may be conducted and findings made. The findings, together with a recommendation, are presented by the staff to the full Commission whose responsibility it is to decide the merits of each case. In the conduct of investigations, the Commission may subpoena witnesses and records and take evidence under oath.

During 1994, the Commission received 21 complaints concerning alleged violations of the campaign finance laws. The disposition of these cases was as follows:

Three complaints were deemed to be outside the Commission's jurisdiction. Of the remaining 18 complaints, 17 concerned disclaimer violations. In 6 of these cases the respondents provided remedy within 10 days of receiving notice of the violation, hence no penalty was assessed. In 7 cases where a violation was found to have occurred and no remedy was made, penalties were assessed. Two cases were dismissed pursuant to a finding of no violation, and one complaint was subsequently withdrawn. The Commission staff conducted an unsuccessful investigation into the source of an anonymous flier. The matter was dismissed for lack of evidence.

Complaints (continued)

Two complaints concerned potential violations of the reporting laws. Both were dismissed on the basis that the evidence brought forward was insufficient to show a violation had occurred.

During 1995, the Commission received seven complaints, five of which pertained to the campaign finance laws. Two were brought by the staff. One concerned an alleged violation of the contribution limitations. Preliminary findings indicated the contribution in question was received during the general election period. The respondent produced evidence showing the contribution was used to pay off primary election debt; hence the matter was dismissed. A second complaint by the staff alleged that the campaign finance report of a political action committee failed to comply with the reporting requirements. The Commission found the report to be in substantial conformance with the law.

One individual filed two separate complaints against the same political action committee (PAC). In each instance, it was alleged that the PAC had falsely attributed a campaign contribution. The Commission voted to subpoena the PAC's records in order to verify the accuracy of the committee's reports. Finally, a complaint brought by the staff involved the late filing of a registration by a political action committee. Again, the Commission voted to subpoena the PAC's records in order to verify the accuracy of the committee's reports. The latter two cases were pending as of December 31, 1995.

Post-Election Year Filings: The post-election filings of primary and general election candidates revealed that 205 candidates ended the election year with active campaign accounts. Under the law, the disposition of any surplus or deficit of more than \$50 in a candidate's account must be disclosed in semiannual reports. To ensure compliance, the Commission staff notifies each candidate subject to post-election year requirements of his or her filing obligations. As with election year reports, filings are monitored for timeliness.

Following the election year, the staff carefully examines each election report to detect any technical errors that may have been missed earlier. When a report is found to be deficient, the candidate's treasurer is notified and asked to make corrections in the form of an amended report.

This final audit is an important step in ensuring that the figures published in the Commission's official election report (pp. 7-46 of this report) are accurate. During 1995, the staff mailed a total of 290 correction notices, following up in many instances by telephone.

Election Year Planning: Once work on the annual report has been completed, planning begins for the next election year. Preparations involve updating written guidelines, instructions, and reporting forms; and compiling new filing schedules.

Municipal Candidates/Party Committees: Prior to the start of each election year, the staff distributes revised reporting forms and instructions to state party committees and to municipal clerks in those cities and towns where candidates for public office are governed by the State campaign finance laws.

SPENDING SUMMARIES - 1994-1995

Spending summaries for the 1994 election year are shown on the following pages. Figures are not adjusted for inflation. The chart on page 8 shows that on average, a Senate seat cost \$24,015 in 1994 -- about the same as in 1992. It should be noted that the 1992 average was skewed by one race costing \$133,000. Thus, the median figures are a more accurate representation of long term activity. They show that median Senate costs have increased steadily since 1984 with costs reaching a record high of \$21,516 in 1994.

On the House side, both average and median costs for the 1994 elections fell for the first time in recent years (see page 13). However, in each of the 1995 special elections, in which control of the House of Representatives was at stake, average costs far exceeded those in 1994 (see page 42). In one critical race, the candidates' combined costs were \$43,562.99, possibly a record high.

One explanation for the drop in House spending in 1994 could be the scarcity of money in a year that saw an exceptionally large field of congressional and gubernatorial candidates compete for funds.

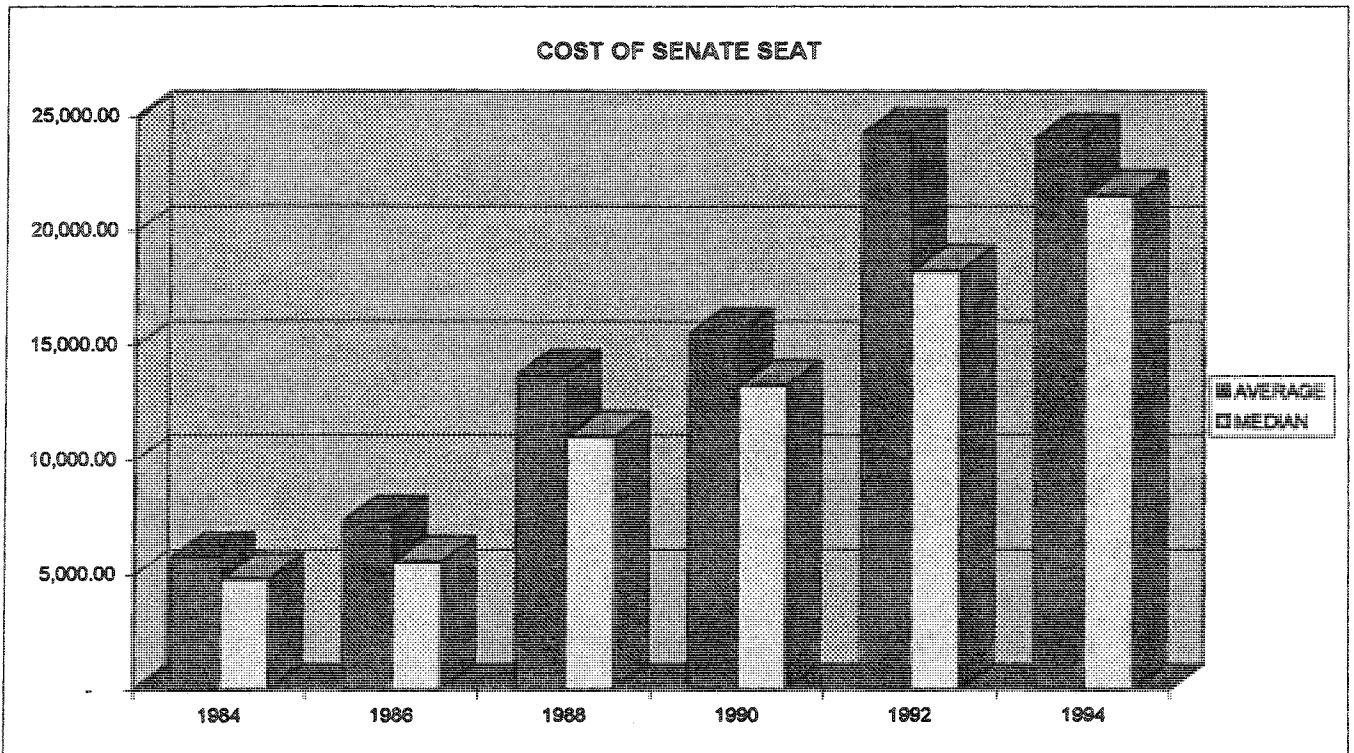
Spending for successful gubernatorial candidates from 1974 through 1994 is shown on page 30. The 1994 figure represents a record high of \$1,743,106. What gives the record added significance is that it reflects only general election costs. Of the candidates shown, only Governor Longley (1974) was outspent by an opponent. It should be noted, however, that his opponent ran in both the primary and general elections, whereas, Mr. Longley, an unenrolled candidate, ran only in the general election.

Although the number of registered candidate PACs increased to a record high of 76 in 1994, overall spending for these PACs increased only slightly over 1992 levels.

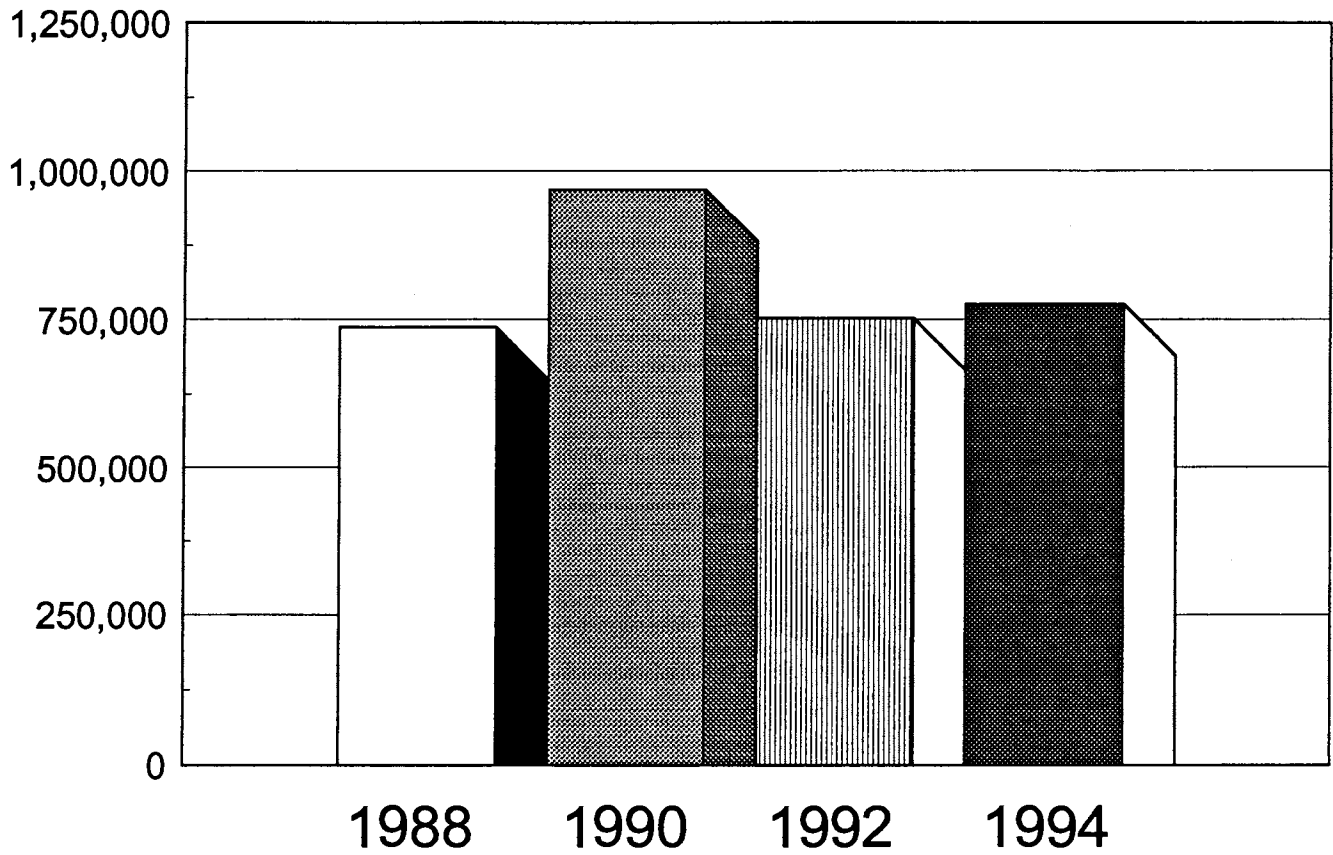

LOBBYIST DISCLOSURE PROCEDURES

The lobbyist disclosure law requires registered lobbyists to file monthly reports with the Commission. The reports must show the compensation received and expenditures made by the lobbyist in support of lobbying activity. Lobbyists must file annual reports as well.

Lobbyist Activity 1994/1995:

Each fall, the staff revises reporting forms and instructions to conform with legal requirements. Packets containing registration forms and instructions for reporting are then mailed to the previous year's registrants. The staff produces and publishes an annual register containing the names and addresses of all registered lobbyists and their employers. In January of each year, the staff compiles and publishes a lobbyist compensation report summarizing the activity of lobbyists for the previous year.

Both the register and the annual report are available for public inspection and may be purchased for a small fee.

The 1994-1995 biennium saw a substantial increase in the number of monthly disclosure filings. The increase was due partly to the growing number of registrations, but also to new nonsession reporting requirements. In all, the staff processed 2,279 reports in 1994 and 2,700 in 1995.

As with campaign finance reports, each monthly disclosure report is monitored for timeliness and completeness. During the lobbying year December 1, 1993 through November 30, 1994, 58 lobbyists filed 146 late reports (some lobbyists filed multiple late reports); and during the period from December 1, 1994 through November 30, 1995, 52 lobbyists filed 86 late reports. During the two-year period covered by this report, 56 lobbyists remitted payment upon being notified of their penalties; and 54 requested waivers. The disposition of those requests appears on pp. 3 and 4 of this report.

1995 Complaint: A complaint involving the timeliness of a lobbyist registration was dismissed on the basis that the applicable law was vague and subject to interpretation.

Special Project: In 1994, the Commission staff undertook a study of the numbers of lobbyists and lobbyist employers conducting business in Maine from 1987 through 1995, and the compensation received by lobbyists from 1989 to 1995. The results of that effort are summarized on page 49 of this report. An additional study concerning the activities of lobbyist employers is summarized on pp. 50 and 68-69.

Special Project (continued):

With respect to Part A (p. 49), it should be noted that the level of activity conducted each year is directly related to the duration of the legislative session; i.e., the first Legislative session, which falls in the even-numbered year, produces more activity than does the shorter alternate session. Hence, while the figures accurately reflect yearly activity, they are of little use in measuring progression. A better gauge are totals for the biennium which combine activity for both the long and short sessions (see Part B).

The study shows that between 1987 and 1995, lobbyist registrations increased 25 percent; the number of individuals lobbying rose 96.5 percent; and the number of persons employing lobbyists increased 21.4 percent. The total compensation paid to lobbyists during 1995 was more than in any year examined in the study.

LAWS ON LEGISLATIVE ETHICS AND FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

Unlike many state codes, Maine's legislative ethics laws do not impose sanctions as a means of resolving ethical problems. Rather they define the standards by which Legislators are expected to abide and they caution Legislators to avoid the appearance of misconduct. The law authorizes the Commission to issue opinions and recommendations and to conduct investigations of potential violations of the conflict of interest laws. But the opinions rendered by the Commission, whether at the request of a Legislator or on the Commission's own motion, are strictly advisory; and the ultimate responsibility for resolving ethical issues rests with the Legislature itself.

A key aspect of the legislative ethics law is personal financial disclosure. Under that law, Legislators as well as Legislative candidates are required to disclose the sources of their personal income, including any unsecured indebtedness. The purpose of such disclosure is threefold: 1) to reveal to citizens any potential conflicts, 2) to remind Legislators of where conflicts may exist, and 3) to discourage Legislators from using their office for personal gain. Statements are made available for public inspection.

Ethics Seminar: To promote awareness of the standards established by the Legislature, the Commission conducted a seminar for Legislators prior to the commencement of the first regular session of the 117th Legislature. The seminar was conducted in conjunction with the Attorney General's office and the Chair of the Legislative Council. Participants included Speaker of the House Dan A. Gwadosky, Justice Francis C. Marsano, Chairman Robert P. McArthur, Assistant Attorney General Cabanne Howard, and Director Marilyn Canavan.

1995 Complaint: A complaint involving a potential conflict of interest was dismissed by the Commission, the charges having been found to be groundless.

INFORMAL ADVISORY OPINIONS

During the 1994/1995 biennium, the Commission issued the following informal advisory opinions in response to the inquiries of candidates, Legislators and others. A word of caution about the general use of these opinions: only persons who receive an advisory opinion from the Commission may rely on the opinion as protection against an adverse finding if a complaint is filed against them. All cases are decided on their own facts. However, the objective in printing these opinions is to increase sensitivity to the laws administered by the Commission.

Inquiries Concerning Conflicts of Interest

QUESTION: A Legislator inquired as to whether he would be in a conflict of interest situation in voting on L.D. 1037: "An Act to Cause Renegotiation of Utility Contracts for Electric Power Generated at Private Facilities." The Legislator manages a small private power-producing company. He also serves as titular head of the company for the purpose of signing documents. For his services, he receives an annual stipend of \$3,500. The company is one of 90-100 such companies in the state that could be affected by the passage or defeat of the bill in question.

OPINION: The Legislator would not have a conflict of interest in voting on the bill for the following reasons: 1) based on the information provided, the Legislator would not benefit financially from the passage or defeat of the bill; 2) the benefit, if any, derived by the Legislator would not be unique or distinct from that derived by the employees of other private power producers in the State; and 3) the company employing the Legislator would derive no greater benefit than any other private power producer in the State.

QUESTION: A Legislator provides professional services at no charge to an acquaintance. Later, the beneficiary of the services sends the Legislator a gift certificate as an expression of gratitude. Is acceptance of the gift permissible under the conflict of interest laws?

OPINION: Acceptance of the gift would not be a violation of the conflict of interest laws because the gift was not made for the purpose of influencing legislation or to influence the Legislator in the performance of her duties.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

QUESTION: A Legislator inquired as to whether he would have a conflict of interest in serving on the Board of Directors of the Jobs for Maine's Graduate Program (JMGP). JMGP is a non-profit 501-3C corporation that works with businesses to secure placement for high school students. The directors function as an advisory board for the President of JMGP. JMGP receives both state and federal funding. Board members receive neither travel expenses nor per diem except on rare occasions when the board pays for lodging and expenses of members attending a conference.

OPINION: The Legislator did not stand to benefit financially from serving on the board; hence, there would be no conflict of interest.

QUESTION: A Legislator inquired as to whether he would have a conflict of interest in voting on L.D. 96: "An Act to Allow Wine Tasting in Fine Wine Stores." The Legislator is employed as a wine importer and broker and holds a Maine Certificate of Approval. He sells directly to wholesalers. The bill would allow limited tasting of wines in stores that qualify as "fine wine stores." Hence, it is reasonable to assume that he, as well as hundreds of Maine Certificate of Approval holders, would be positively affected by the bill.

OPINION: The Legislator would not have a conflict of interest in voting on the bill because the benefit derived by the Legislator as a result of the bill's passage would not be unique or distinct from that of persons engaged in similar employment.

QUESTION: The Legislative Ethics Law requires legislators to disclose each source of income from which the Legislator derives \$1,000 or more. Must the Legislator disclose separately each source of income of \$1,000 or more derived from a self-directed mutual fund or IRA account.

OPINION: Each source of income of more than \$1,000 within an IRA or mutual fund must be separately disclosed where the fund or IRA is self-directed.

QUESTION: For purposes of the income disclosure laws, is an individual considered "self-employed" or "employed by another" if the individual's employment consists of a majority interest in a corporation?

OPINION: In the Commission's view, employment by a corporation does not constitute self-employment whether or not the person employed by the corporation holds a majority interest in that corporation.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

Inquiries Concerning Campaign Finance

QUESTION: Are partnerships subject to the same contribution limitations that apply to a committee, association or corporation?

OPINION: The term "partnership" does not appear in the contribution limitation law. However, in the absence of statutory guidance, the Commission has expressed the view that partnerships are a subclassification of "association" and, as such, they are subject to the limitations set forth in 21-A M.R.S.A. Section 1015(2) which prohibit any committee, corporation, or association from contributing more than \$5,000 in the aggregate to a candidate or a candidate committee, in any election.

QUESTION: Are the commissions earned by a political party committee as the result of a business arrangement between the party committee and a corporation considered campaign contributions under Maine law?

OPINION: The earnings of the party in such an arrangement do not constitute campaign contributions because the purpose of the person making the payments was other than to influence the nomination or election of a person to office or to retire a candidate's debt.

QUESTION: A party committee publishes a tourist's guide as a service to citizens in the area. The Guide, distributed by the Maine Publicity Bureau, depicts maps and lists various points of interest in the area. The party committee solicits advertisements for the guide from local businesses. The earnings derived therefrom go to the party. Must these earnings be reported as campaign contributions to the party committee?

OPINION: The earnings in question do not constitute campaign contributions and are thus not reportable because the purpose of the persons placing the ads was to enhance business, not to influence the nomination or election of a candidate to office or to retire a candidate's debt.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

Note: On rendering its advice, the Commission advised the party committee to inform those businesses from whom it solicits advertisements that the earnings derived therefrom go to the committee.

QUESTION: A candidate has appointed one authorized political committee to promote his candidacy. What is the permissibility of the candidate forming several subgroups of that committee; i.e., a women's subcommittee, a physician's subcommittee, etc. The function of the subcommittees would be to hold fund-raisers and publish ads and/or literature.

OPINION: A candidate is permitted to form only one political committee to promote that candidate's candidacy. However, a candidate may form one or more subcommittees provided that the candidate meets the following conditions: 1) the candidate's primary political committee pays for any political advertisements or publications of the subcommittees, 2) advertisements published by the subcommittees are attributed to the primary political committee, 3) all contributions are made payable to the primary political committee, and 4) all campaign expenditures are made by the primary political committee.

QUESTION: For reporting purposes, when is a campaign contribution considered "received": 1) the date on which the candidate or treasurer receives the contribution, or 2) the date on which the treasurer deposits the contribution into the campaign account?

OPINION: The law requires candidates to disclose the "date a contribution is received," but it does not define the word "received." The Commission thus advises that candidates and others be guided by the dictionary definition of "receive" -- that definition being to "acquire" or "be taken"; and that pursuant to that interpretation, the reportable date of a contribution is the date the candidate or treasurer acquired or took the contribution.

QUESTION: While travelling on campaign business with a friend, a candidate is provided with free lodging at a motel owned by the friend's family. The room fee is waived at the friend's behest. Does the cost of the motel room constitute an in-kind contribution to the candidate?

OPINION: The purpose of the donor in making the gift was to further the candidate's candidacy. Therefore, the cost of the motel room must be reported as an in-kind contribution at the fair market value of the room fee. By the same token, if the friend is travelling as a campaign associate, the cost of his or her accommodations must likewise be reported.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

QUESTION: A vendor provides a candidate with printed campaign materials at no charge because the vendor is dissatisfied with the quality of those materials. Do the materials constitute an in-kind contribution to the candidate?

OPINION: Both the materials and the services provided by the vendor constitute in-kind contributions which are reportable at their fair market value.

QUESTION: A vendor donates campaign fliers to a candidate. The vendor advertises his own business on the reverse side of the fliers. Are there legal prohibitions against this arrangement?

ANSWER: Under the campaign finance law, the arrangement would not be prohibited. However, the fliers constitute an in-kind contribution which the candidate must report at their fair market value.

QUESTION: An individual pledges to contribute \$1,000 to a candidate before the primary election and then makes another such pledge during the general election period. If the individual honors both these pledges during the general election period, does the transaction constitute a violation of the contribution limitation law which prohibits an individual from donating more than \$1,000 to a candidate in an election.

OPINION: The transaction would not violate the contribution limitation law because a pledge is considered a campaign contribution under 21-A M.R.S.A. Section 1012(2)(A)(2), and because the pledges were made in separate elections. However, the portion of the contribution representing the primary election pledge must be used to retire primary election debt.

QUESTION: A candidate purchases calendars and tip cards with personal funds and then distributes these items from a Party Committee booth at the county fair. Do the items constitute an in-kind contribution/expenditure to the candidate's campaign? If so, must the items carry attribution?

OPINION: The candidate's intent to promote his candidacy is inferred by the context in which the candidate distributed the items. Hence the items constitute an in-kind contribution/expenditure which must be reported by the candidate. The items need not be attributed since they do not contain language that expressly advocates the election of a clearly identified candidate.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

QUESTION: Is the donation of surplus campaign funds to a municipality a legitimate use of surplus funds?

OPINION: Such a donation would be impermissible under 21-A MRSA Section 1017(8) which details the manner in which surplus campaign funds may be spent.

QUESTION: A candidate for legislative leadership makes contributions to candidates for state office. Must the leadership candidate report the transactions as expenditures on his candidate report.

OPINION: If the contributions were made with the candidate's campaign funds, they are reportable on the candidate's report. If the contributions were made with personal funds, the transactions are not reportable by the legislative leadership candidate.

QUESTION: A Legislator gives a party for her Legislative colleagues and uses surplus campaign funds to pay for refreshments. Is the payment a legitimate use of surplus campaign funds?

OPINION: If the purpose of the function is to discuss or promote legislation or to conduct other legislative business, the expenditure is permissible. Expenditures for a social gathering would not be permissible under the surplus funds provision.

QUESTION: After an election, a candidate wishes to use surplus campaign funds to reimburse her spouse for campaign-related services. The candidate did not list the services in her election year reports. Is the expense a legitimate use of surplus funds?

OPINION: The expenditure is permissible if the candidate can produce evidence in the form of a 1099 IRS statement showing that the candidate contracted with her spouse to perform the services. The candidate must also file amended reports itemizing the services provided and showing the fair market value of each.

Advisory Opinions (continued):

QUESTION: A Legislator has served in the same office for 8 years. Hence, under the term limit law, the Legislator will be unable to seek the same office in a subsequent election. The Legislator has no campaign indebtedness. May the Legislator accept a campaign contribution?

OPINION: Before accepting any campaign contributions, the Legislator must demonstrate that he/she is a candidate for an office other than the one the Legislator now holds. The candidate could do this by qualifying by petition, or by registering with the Commission.

Inquiry Concerning Lobbyist Disclosure

QUESTION: A lobbyist terminates his employment toward the end of the lobbying year. His employer then hires another person to lobby on his behalf. Must the person replacing the lobbyist file a new joint registration with the employer?

OPINION: The new lobbyist and his employer must file a joint registration with the Commission and pay the full \$200 registration fee since there are no provisions exempting "replacement" lobbyists from registering.

LEGISLATION

Lobbyist Disclosure

- In 1994, the Legislature relaxed lobbyist disclosure requirements which required lobbyists to register within 15 business days of commencing lobbying activity. For many years, the provision had served to ensure early registration by lobbyists who are employed for the specific purpose of lobbying. The new law permits persons to lobby up to 8 hours each month without having to register; i.e., registration is triggered only when the lobbyist exceeds the 8-hour mark during a calendar month.

Because of problems experienced by the Commission in administering the new law, members voted to hold a public hearing to discuss possible changes. Among the changes proposed was elimination of the 8-hour window. Lobbyists and public interest groups alike were invited to attend the hearing. Groups like Common Cause, the Maine League of Women Voters, and Maine People's Alliance attended and expressed strong support for the proposal as did some lobbyists. Consequently, the Commission submitted a draft of the proposal to the Legislative Council for introduction in the second regular session of the 117th Legislature. The Council rejected the proposal by a vote of 4-4.

Campaign Finance

- In 1995, the Commission proposed changes in the formula used to calculate penalties for late campaign finance reports. The proposal makes the basis for calculating penalties a percentage of the filer's total contributions or expenditures for the filing period, times the number of days the report is filed late. These percentages are: one percent for the first violation, three percent for the second violation, and five percent for the third and each subsequent violation. The bill was approved unanimously by the Legal Affairs Committee, enacted by the Legislature, and signed into law on July 3, 1995.
- In 1995, the Legislature passed a campaign finance reform bill which establishes voluntary spending limits for House and Senate candidates. The limits are: for Senate candidates - \$25,000 per election; for House candidates - \$5,000 per election. The bill requires the Commission to publish the names of those who subscribe to spending limits.
- In 1995, the Legislature passed a measure prohibiting any individual running for a Constitutional office to form a political action committee or to be involved in decision making for or solicit contributions to a political action committee.
