Findings from the Review of the Board of Underground Storage Tank Installers Pursuant to the Government Evaluation Act

The Government Evaluation Act

The Government Evaluation Act ("Act") provides for a system of periodic review of the efficacy and performance of state government agencies. The keystone to the Act is the agency program evaluation report, which consists of a number of components required by the statute.

Review Process

Pursuant to the requirements of the Act, the Joint Standing Committee on Environment and Natural Resources notified the Board of Underground Storage Tank Installers of its intent to review the Board. The Board submitted its Program Evaluation Report and the Committee held a worksession on the report on January 4, 2012.

Findings of Review

The Board's statutory mandate is to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare; protect the public from incompetent and unauthorized persons; ensure the highest degree of professional conduct on the part of installers, removers and inspectors; and ensure availability of services (Title 32 MRSA §10001). In its review, the Committee found that the Board of Underground Storage Tank Installers is operating within its statutory authority.

The Committee recognizes the concerns identified by the Board regarding the difficulty of maintaining and developing an adequate supply of trained individuals to meet the demand for installation and inspection services, as well as the anticipated demand for trained individuals to replace the current population of facilities which will all require replacement in a few years.

The Committee commends the Board and its staff for its commitment to providing this necessary service.
