Innovative Interfaces, Inc.	37,236.00	1	The Maine State Library initially chose this product in Maine and colleges and universities in the State followed their lead. Innovative Interfaces, Inc. offers service contract/support services for Millennium Software that is used by libraries for their main software package.
