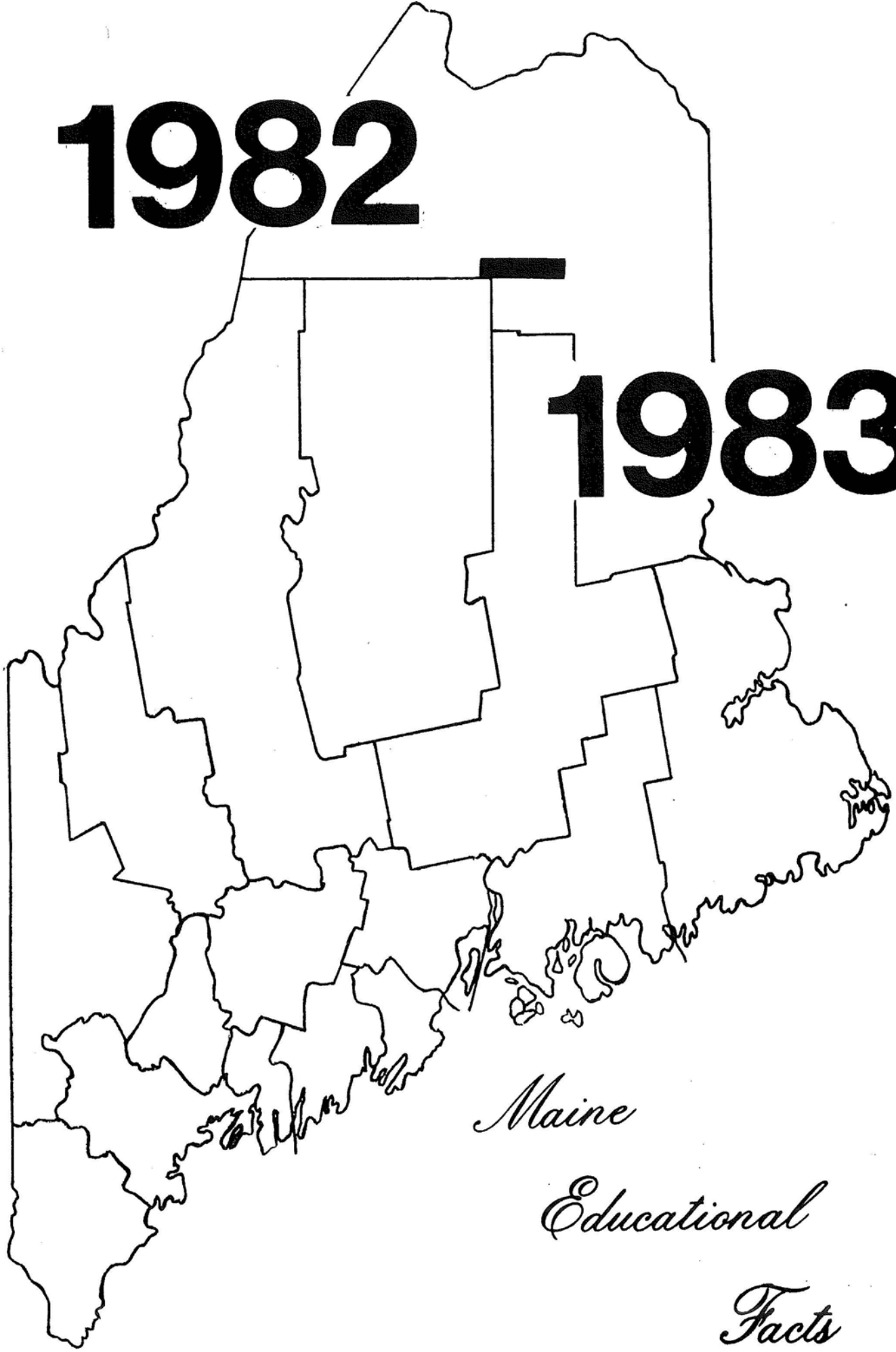

SUMMARY OF
"MAINE EDUCATIONAL FACTS"

Title 20 - Chapter 105 § 911. "Education is compulsory for pupils from age 7 to 17."

In 1983 Maine had a Fall Enrollment of 209,753 enrolled in 756 public schools (610 elementary, 105 secondary and 41 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 12,283 staff members. A total of 15,461 students were enrolled in private schools, (70 elementary, 22 secondary, and 34 combined elementary and secondary) and were taught by 1,035 teachers.

Maine's 496 towns are now divided into 73 school administrative districts with 278 towns, 35 cities and towns under individual supervision, 21 towns under district superintendents and agents of the commissioner and 13 community school districts with 39 towns, leaving 121 towns in 35 unions.

The cost of public education continues to rise. The cost per pupil, excluding transportation, capital outlay and debt service, was \$1,598.34 per elementary and \$1,955.19 per secondary.

Much has been done to encourage young people to complete their secondary education and advance into post-secondary education. Of the 16,604 high school graduates (14,764 public and 1,840 private) in 1983, 47.5% of the public high school graduates and 70% of the private high school graduates continued their education--a combined percentage of 50.1%. Approximately 67% of these are continuing their education in Maine institutions. Of the 64,951 secondary students, there were 2,364 dropouts which gave Maine a 3.6% dropout rate for the 1982-83 school year.
