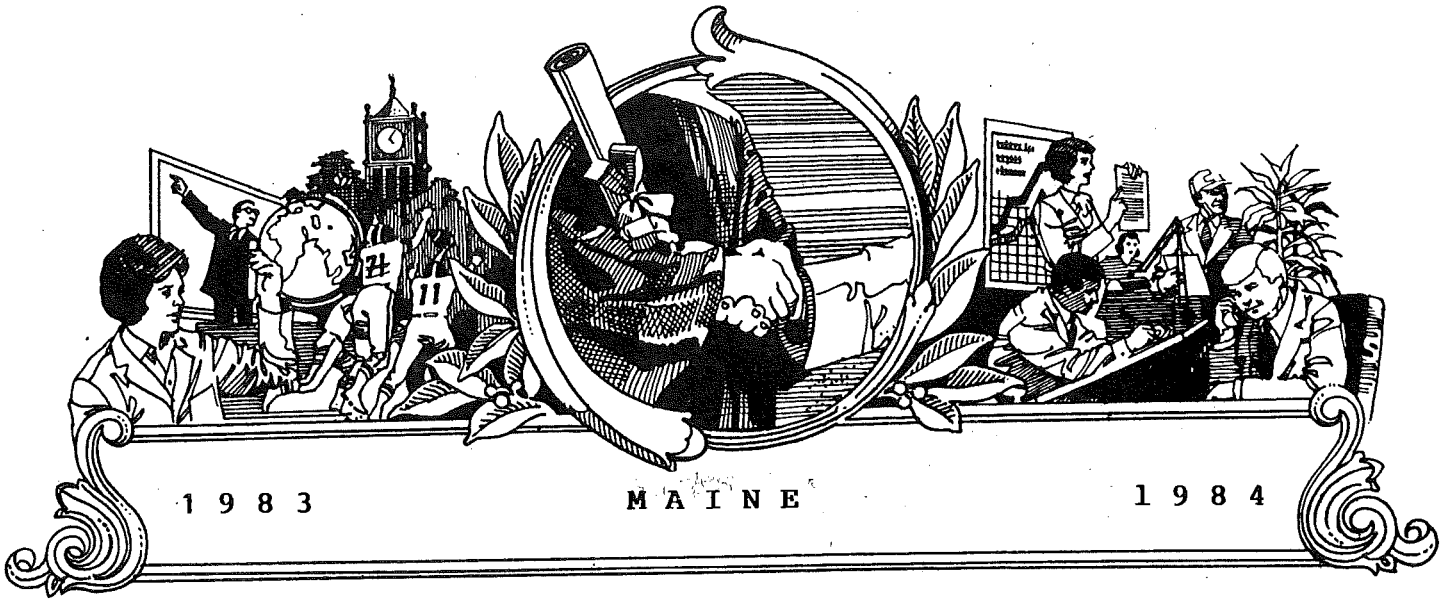

**SUMMARY OF**  
**"MAINE EDUCATIONAL FACTS"**

In 1984 Maine had a fall enrollment of 207,839 enrolled in 746 public schools (606 elementary, 100 secondary and 40 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 12,707 staff members. A total of 14,880 students were enrolled in private schools (68 elementary, 21 secondary and 30 combined elementary and secondary) and were taught by 892 teachers.

Maine's 496 towns and cities are now divided into 73 school administrative districts with 278 towns, 35 cities and towns under individual supervision, 21 towns under district superintendents and agents of the Commissioner, 3 units for schooling of Indian children, 13 community school districts with 39 towns, leaving 120 towns in 35 unions.

The cost of public education continues to rise. The cost per pupil, excluding transportation, capital outlay and debt service, was \$1,735.03 per elementary and \$2,150.53 per secondary.

Much has been done to encourage young people to complete their secondary education and advance into post-secondary education. Of the 15,805 high school graduates, (13,935 public and 1,870 private) in 1984, 49.4% of the public high school graduates and 68.5% of the private high school graduates continued their education--a combined percentage of 51.7%. Approximately 65% of these are continuing their education in Maine institutions. Of the 63,858 public secondary students, there were 2,314 dropouts which gave Maine a 3.6% dropout rate for the 1983-84 school year.
