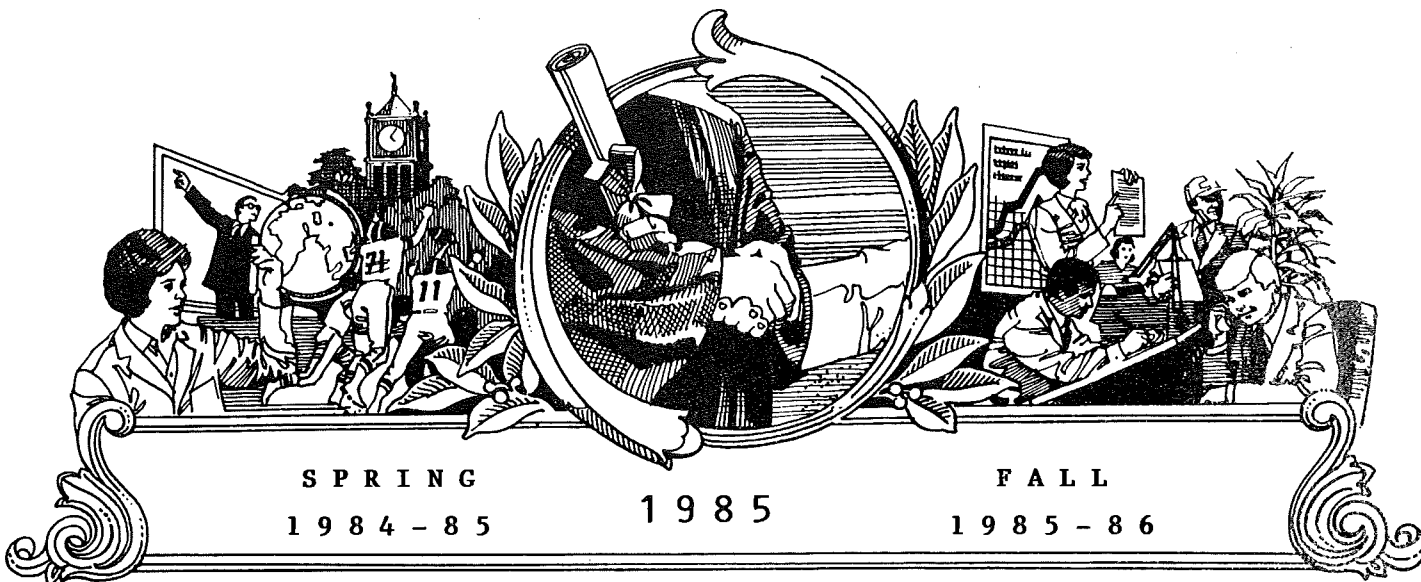

**S U M M A R Y O F**  
**" M A I N E E D U C A T I O N A L F A C T S "**

In 1985 Maine had a fall enrollment of 206,827 enrolled in 748 public schools (604 elementary, 102 secondary and 42 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 13,085 staff members. A total of 14,449 students were enrolled in private schools (60 elementary, 21 secondary and 27 combined elementary and secondary) and were taught by 930 teachers.

Maine's 496 towns and cities are now divided into 73 school administrative districts with 278 towns, 36 cities and towns under individual supervision, 21 towns under district superintendents and agents of the Commissioner, 3 units for schooling of Indian children, 13 community school districts with 39 towns, leaving 119 towns in 35 unions.

The cost of public education continues to rise. The cost per pupil, excluding transportation, capital outlay and debt service, was \$1,749.63 per elementary and \$2,351.98 per secondary.

Much has been done to encourage young people to complete their secondary education and advance into postsecondary education. Of the 15,721 high school graduates, (13,924 public and 1,797 private) in 1985, 58.4% of the public high school graduates and 77.2% of the private high school graduates continued their education--a combined percentage of 53.5%. Approximately 64.6% of these are continuing their education in Maine institutions.

Of the public secondary schools, 111 reported with 58,384 total enrollment, there were 2,061 dropouts which gave Maine a 3.5% dropout rate for the 1984-85 school year.
