

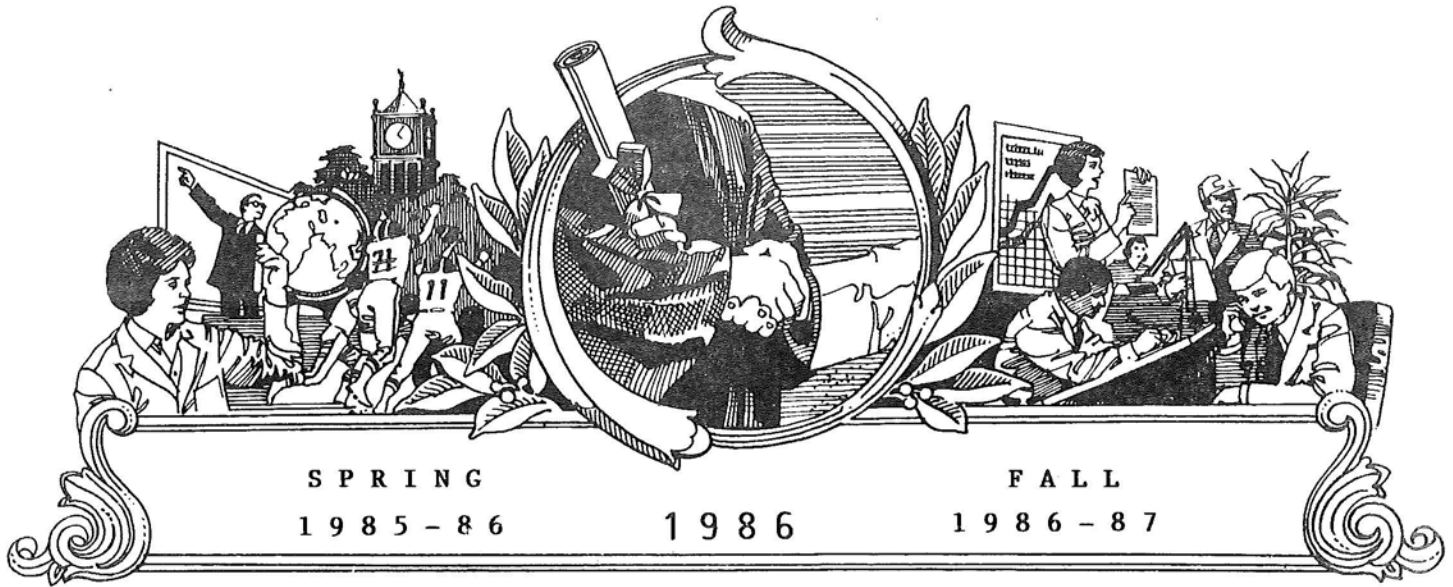

S U M M A R Y O F
" M A I N E E D U C A T I O N A L F A C T S "

In 1986 Maine had a fall enrollment of 207,349 enrolled in 743 public schools (599 elementary, 103 secondary and 41 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 13,411 teachers. A total of 14,272 students were enrolled in 108 private schools (62 elementary, 20 secondary and 23 combined elementary and secondary). These students were taught by 961 teachers.

Maine's 495 towns and cities are now divided into 73 school administrative districts with 278 towns, 39 cities and towns under individual supervision, 20 towns under district superintendents and agents of the Commissioner, 13 community school districts with 39 towns, leaving 119 towns in 36 unions.

The cost of public education continues to rise. The cost per pupil, excluding transportation, capital outlay and debt service, was \$1,923.03 per elementary and \$2,545.31 per secondary.

Much has been done to encourage young people to complete their secondary education and advance into postsecondary education. Of the 14,773 high school graduates, (13,006 public and 1,767 private) in 1986, 53.6% of the public high school graduates and 76.2% of the private high school graduates continued their education -- a combined percentage of 56.3%. Approximately 61.9% of these are continuing their education in Maine institutions.

Of the public secondary schools, 119 reported with 66,767 total enrollment, there were 2,372 dropouts which gave Maine a 3.6% dropout rate for the 1985-86 school year.
