

INTRODUCTION

This report has been prepared as the seventh in a series of reports which provide detailed profiles of physicians in Maine.

The reports are comprised of detailed tabulations of Maine physicians which are designed to address the needs of health planners, educators, and researchers who require detailed information. Special purpose tabulations are prepared as needed in response to specific requests.

The data tables presented within this report are based upon inventories conducted throughout 1995 and 1996 (allopathic physicians) and January 1996 (osteopathic physicians).

The data supporting the compilation of tables found in this report as well as special tabulations are available for further analysis.

TECHNICAL NOTES

BACKGROUND: The Health Manpower component of the Cooperative Health Statistics System (CHSS) was implemented in Maine in 1976. This system, developed by the National Center for Health Statistics, included descriptive data on thirteen licensed health occupations including allopathic physicians, osteopathic physicians, and dentists. Since its inception, these data bases have been maintained and updated by the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics, Maine Department of Human Services.

In 1981, the National Center for Health Statistics withdrew funding for this system nationwide. As a result, data collection on most of the thirteen professions has been discontinued. In Maine, survey activities for physicians and dentists have continued, utilizing funds from other sources.

<u>DATA COLLECTION</u>: Physician licensure is carried out by two separate, autonomous boards of licensure, the Board of Licensure in Medicine for allopaths, and the Board of Osteopathic Licensure for ostepaths with separate dates.

for relicensure. Osteopathic physician health manpower surveys are conducted biennially. For all physicians, the Health Manpower Resource Inventory is enclosed with the relicensure application, mailed by the respective board 90 days prior to the relicensure date and returned to the board. For allopaths license renewals are done on a monthly basis. While each physician licenses biennially, the renewals for allopaths are based on the physician's date of birth.

Survey information is provided by the licensee on a voluntary basis and is not, in general, further verified. Data in this report are thus subject to the usual limitations associated with the use of mail questionnaire data collection procedures.

The returned surveys are checked for accuracy; response rates are computed; and a follow-up is conducted either by mail or telephone. Survey responses are entered and a data base is created; data processing and report generation are carried out by the Cooperative Health Manpower Resource Inventory System.

TABULATIONS: Federally employed physicians who do not provide patient care outside a federal facility are not required to maintain an active Maine license; also, physicians participating in residency programs are not required to maintain a Maine license. While some such individuals choose to maintain a license, many others do not. Only those physicians who are licensed in Maine are included in this report. In addition, a substantial number of physicians maintain Maine licenses even though they neither work nor live in Maine; these physicians are excluded from this data collection effort.

It should be noted that for osteopathic physicians, the relatively small number of active licensees may lead to small numbers of persons in specific tabulations and thus preclude meaningful analysis and comparison.

<u>comparability with Earlier Data</u>: Tabulations presented in this report are based on edited files which have been corrected for missing and erroneous information which came to light during initial data compilation; there may be, therefore, some discrepancies with preliminary data published earlier. Data displayed in these early reports are superseded by the tabulations in the present document.

In 1980, all allopathic physicians who held valid Maine licenses were surveyed; this included more than 2,000 physicians who neither worked nor lived in Maine. Since 1982, only allopathic physicians who were living or working in Maine were surveyed. For that reason, some tables appearing in this publication contain different data than tables from reports published prior to 1982.

Comparisons of 1996 data on patient care hours and specialty hours with the same data items from surveys conducted prior to 1982 also must be made with caution. Since 1982, on call hours have been collected as a separate item on physician surveys. Prior to this, many physicians reported on call hours in with patient care hours and specialty hours; others did not report on call hours in any category. Because of this difference in data collection for these items, tables displaying patient care hours (e.g., Table 6) often showed a decrease in patient care hours worked from 1980 to more recent years but an increase in hours worked per week in all activities (included on call hours).

Also, prior to 1982, physicians who reported more than one specialty were excluded from tables displaying hours worked by primary specialty. Since then, physician hours are shown under the reported primary specialty regardless of other specialties. In instances where hours were reported in more than one specialty, the total of hours worked in all specialties is displayed by the physician's primary specialty. Since 1980, only physicians with unreported hours are excluded from these tables.

<u>RESPONSE RATES</u>: Over-all in-state response rates of 93.8% for allopathic physicians and 99.7% for osteopathic physicians were obtained over the course of the 1996 data collection process, which included an initial mailing, two follow-up mailings, and telephone contact for survey non-response. For allopathic physicians this is somewhat lower than in previous years. In 1995, the Board of Registration in Medicine changed the license renewal process from a fixed date, in which all licensed physicians renewed their licenses, to a monthly system based on the physician's date of birth. The license continues to be a two year license. This change temporarily effected our tracking and follow -up.

DEFINITIONS

GEOGRAPHIC AREAS: Tables in this report are presented by Maine's sixteen counties or for the state as a whole. As data are collected and stored at the town level, special reports can be produced by municipality or combinations of municipalities upon request.

<u>AGE</u>: Age is obtained from date of birth. The date of birth may be available for non-respondents from previous surveys or from the boards.

<u>ACTIVITY STATUS</u>: This category indicates whether the respondent considers himself/herself to be currently active as a physician. Active respondents are then asked number of weeks worked in the last year and number of hours worked in an average week. As definitions of full-time and part-time vary, the hours may be grouped to suit the desired definitions.

SPECIALTY: Physicians are asked to identify their specialty. This information is thus obtained through voluntary self-identification and self-assessment and does not imply board certification or board eligibility.

BOARD CERTIFIED SPECIALTY: Physicians are asked to identify their board certified specialty, if appropriate; they may report up to two, no effort is made to verify this information.

<u>PRIMARY CARE SPECIALTIES</u>: A primary care specialty is one of the following areas of practice: general practice, family practice, obstetrics, gynecology, internal medicine, and pediatrics.
