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

## GUIDELINES FOR DATA USE

It should also include a disclaimer which credits any further analyses, interpretations, or conclusions reached to the author, and not to the Bureau.
- b. Recipients who wish to publish a technical description of the data should make a reasonable effort to insure that the description is not inconsistent with that published by the Bureau.



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## INTRODUCTION

This report has been prepared as one in a series of reports which provide detailed profiles of selected health professions in Maine. It is part of the second tier in a three-tiered data library. General purpose reports, providing broad profiles of interest to a wide audience of individuals and organizations involved in health fields, constitute the first tier of this library. The second tier is comprised of detailed tabulations for selected health professions to fill the needs of health planners, educators, and researchers for more detailed information. The third tier consists of special purpose tabulations prepared as needed in response to specific requests.

The data tables presented within this report have been prepared from data collected through 1981 surveys of Physician Assistants and Nurse Practitioners certified/approved in Maine (see Appendix for survey copies). 1981 was the first year of data collection on these professions through the Cooperative Health Manpower Resources System. In order to assure that uniform data are available on all health occupations surveyed through this system, a core set of data items asked of all professions was incorporated into the Physician Assistant and Nurse Practitioner surveys as well. In addition to these items, occupation-specific questions were designed to collect information of particular interest within the physician extender occupations.

Physician extenders work under the supervision of actively practicing Maine physicians; their functions and responsibilities are governed by legislation, the two physician boards of licensure (MD, DO), the Board of Nursing, and supervising physician protocol.

In a rural state, such as Maine, the use and impact of physician extenders on the health care system is of considerable interest. The data displayed in this report are intended to address that interest and to provide baseline data upon which an assessment of the impact of physician extenders can be made.

## TECHNICAL NOTES

### Background

In 1980, the Division of Data and Research was awarded a state agency development contract from the National Center for Health Statistics (Contract #HRA 233-80-2103). Through this contract a number of activities were undertaken in order to increase and refine the functional capabilities of the Division of Data and Research. One of these activities was the development of a data base on Maine's physician extenders.

This project was undertaken in order to address the growing interest in mid-level health professionals and the expressed need of health planners for data which would allow them to assess the impact of physician extender services on Maine's health care system.

### Professional Certification/Approval

Certification of physician assistants and approval of nurse practitioners to practice in Maine is carried out by separate autonomous boards of licensure.

Physician assistant certification is conducted by the Board of Registration in Medicine or the Board of Registration and Examination in Osteopathic Medicine. This process is undertaken biennially for all active physician assistants practicing in Maine. It should be noted that certification is contingent upon employment in Maine and the presence of a supervising physician who assumes responsibility for the extender's professional performance.

Nurse practitioners are approved through the Maine State Board of Nursing. This process involves Board approval of the nurse practitioner training program from which the individual graduates. The individual is certified through the training program and approval of the program by the Board allows the nurse to practice as a nurse practitioner in Maine. For this reason, the approval process happens only once and the individual may legally practice as a nurse practitioner in Maine as long as he/she holds a valid Maine registered nurse license. Approval is conducted by the Board on an ongoing basis as applications are received.

#### Data Collection

Data collection was conducted on both professions in June, 1981. The certification list for physician assistants was effective as of January, 1981 and as of April, 1981 for nurse practitioners. Surveys were conducted independently by the Division of Data and Research with endorsement by the respective boards of licensure.

Survey information was provided by the licensee on a voluntary basis and was not in general further verified. Data in this report are thus subject to the usual limitations associated with the use of mail questionnaire data collection procedures.

The returned surveys were checked for accuracy, response rates were computed, and a follow-up was conducted either by mail or telephone. Survey responses were coded, key-punched, and verified; data processing and report generation were carried out by the staff of the Division of Data and Research.

### 1981 Population Data

Population figures for 1981 are population estimates published in Population Estimates for Minor Civil Division by County - Maine 1981 prepared by the Division of Data and Research, Bureau of Health Planning and Development. Population estimates are prepared annually and reflect changes in births, deaths, and estimated net migration for each Maine county and town. County population estimates for 1981 are included as Appendix 2.

### Tabulations

The data displayed in this report do not reflect all data collected through the physician extender resource inventories. There is some variation in data elements in each licensed profession, but generally the core items are: address (residence and employment), activity status, reason for inactivity, date of birth, years active, weeks worked per year, hours worked per week by activity, form and setting of employment, specialty and specialty hours.

### Limitations

Tabulations are based on edited files which have been corrected for missing and erroneous information which came to light subsequent to initial data compilation; therefore, there may be some discrepancies with reports circulated prior to this publication. Data in these early reports are superseded by the tabulations in the present document.

Response Rates

A 100% overall survey response rate was achieved on physician assistants. Data were obtained through returned surveys and through information provided by the licensing board.

For nurse practitioners, an overall response rate of 59.9% and an in-state response rate of 68.6% was achieved. A low response rate for this profession was due primarily to the fact that nurse practitioners are approved only once and are not required to renew on an annual basis. For that reason, name and address changes are not kept current at the board; many professionals could not be located for the purpose of this survey.

Although the low response rate on nurse practitioners may preclude detailed analysis of the characteristics of those professionals, these data can be used for general descriptive purposes and for general comparisions with physician assistants and other health professionals. These data are also useful in assessing the minimum impact that this profession has on Maine's health care system.

## DEFINITIONS

Physician Extenders This term refers to skilled health professionals qualified by academic and practical training to provide patient services which fall between the traditional roles of nurse and physician. In this report, physician extender refers to two groups of health professionals: physician assistants and nurse practitioners.

Geographic Area: Tables are presented by Maine's sixteen counties or for the state as a whole. Special reports can be produced by municipality or any combination of municipalities such as Planning and Development Districts, Nursing Home Analysis Areas, or Regional Planning Commission Areas. Geographic area of either residence or employment may be used.

Names and residence address are provided by the Boards. However, residence information is used only in three instances: 1) to account for and assign all non-respondents to a town; 2) to assign all inactive licensees to a town; and 3) to reconcile and show movement across county or state lines for active licensees.

Age: Age is obtained from date of birth. The date of birth may be available for non-respondents from the Board.


Activity Status: This category indicates whether the respondent considers himself/herself to be currently active in the licensed profession (Physician Assistants must be active for their certification to be in force). Active respondents are then asked the number of weeks worked in the last year and number of hours worked in an average week. As definitions of full-time and part-time vary, the hours may be grouped to suit the desired definitions.

## DEFINITIONS (Cont.)

Specialty: Physician extenders are asked to identify their specialty. This information is thus obtained through voluntary self-identification and self-assessment.

Primary Care Specialty: These specialties are general practice, family practice, general internal medicine, general pediatrics, obstetrics, and gynecology.






