

FOREWORD

This is the first and last Roll Call Register of its kind.

It has been prepared for legislators, the news media and citizens interested in the recorded vote.

It came about because of numerous requests for complete roll call records of individual members. To assemble such records on a singular basis is very time consuming and costly. Accordingly, having a limited staff, it was felt that for service, efficiency and economies which could be realized, it would be in the best interest of all to have one composition available for all interested parties.

Beginning with the convening of the 103rd Legislature, the Clerk of the House will no longer "call the roll," instead, an electrical roll call system will record, in a fast and accurate manner, on permanent duplicate record cards, the vote of Representatives. In addition, the vote may be witnessed by those present upon two huge main indicator boards, automatically displaying final totals, silently and at high speed.

No such system as described above has been installed in the Senate for it was felt, because of the small membership (thirty-four), it would be too costly and would not materially reduce the length of Senate Sessions.

There are, currently, electrical roll call systems in thirty-four states (Maine included*), seven of which have such units in both branches of the legislature. Also, the General Assembly of the United Nations has such apparatus.

Considering this project a necessary service and having charge of all the documents and papers of every kind confided to the care of the House, all recipients requiring further details need never hesitate to call upon this office for assistance.
