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
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
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

#### ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The statistical data upon which the charts in this report are based were collected as a cooperative effort by many individuals and groups.

The initial development work for this data system was carried out in the mid-1970s with funding obtained by the Department through a contract (#HRA 106-74-110) with the National Center for Health Statistics. The work represented in this report was completed by the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics (ODRVS).

The 1981 survey effort was conducted under the terms of a contract with the National Center for Health Statistics. The 1987 data were collected and processed as the result of legislation which directed the Office to provide data to the Commission on Nursing Supply and Educational Accessibility. The Commission provided guidance and direction concerning the issues and specific details which needed to be addressed on their behalf; utilizing this information, the Office implemented a statewide survey to obtain the needed data.

The funding required to support this survey effort in 1981 was provided by the National Center for Health Statistics; for the 1987 effort, funding for this survey and other Commission tasks was provided by the Department of Human Services and the Maine State Board of Nursing which also provided the licensee lists necessary to undertake the surveys in both years. The surveys could not have been successful without the willingness of individual nurses to supply the data. Their cooperation is gratefully acknowledged.

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#### HIGHLIGHTS

- The pool of licensed registered nurses in Maine increased by 2,134 nurses between 1981 and 1987, an increase of 23%; there was a 30% increase in the number of active nurses. The number and percent of active nurses, during that time, increased in all Maine counties except Sagadahoc county.
- The active nurse to county population ratio improved in all but three counties between 1981 and 1987. Statewide the ratio improved from an average of one nurse to every 177 people in 1981 to one nurse to every 143 people in 1987.
- \* From 1981 to 1987, there was an overall increase of 39% (1971) in the numbers of active nurses aged 25 to 54; however, there was an overall decrease of 6% (72) in the numbers of very young (less than 25 years old) and older active nurses (aged 55 and older).
- \* From 1981 to 1987, there was an increase of 1,653 general duty (or staff) nurses an increase of 52%. Half of all active registered nurses indicated they were general duty nurses in 1981; by 1987, this proportion grew to 58%.
- Although there were increases in the number of active nurses indicating that they held positions as instructors, head nurses, and nurse anesthetists (from 1,345 to 1,452), proportionally fewer indicated these types of positions in 1987 than in 1981 (from 21% of active nurses to 18%).
- \* In 1987, there were 1,538 more nurses indicating that their primary work setting was the hospital, a 39% increase; proportionally, 4% more nurses were hospital-based in 1987 than in 1981.
- \* From 1981 to 1987, 44% more nurses indicated their major area of practice was medical/surgical (an increase of 1,061), 50% more as public health (an increase of 188), 64% more as mental health (an increase of 196), and 24% more as geriatrics (an increase of 165). For geriatrics, this increase in numbers did not offset a proportional loss of ½% in geriatric nursing.
- In 1987, 329 fewer active nurses stated that the diploma was the highest degree held than in 1981 (an 8% decrease); however, there was a 97% increase in the number of nurses reporting Associates, Bachelors in nursing, and Masters in nursing degrees as their highest degree (from 1,763 to 3,478).
- \* The numbers of active nurses working less than forty hours each week increased by 51% (1,272 nurses) and by 17% for those working forty or more hours between 1981 and 1987 (611 nurses).
- \* There was a 35% increase (686) in the number of inactive licensed nurses between 1981 and 1987; however, the proportion of inactive nurses remained relatively constant from 1981 to 1987 (31% and 32%, respectively).

- \* The number of inactive licensed nurses who were working in another field and not seeking work in nursing more than doubled between 1981 and 1987 (from 267 to 637).
- \* The number of retired nurses increased by 62% (from 508 to 822) with 5% more licensed inactive nurses reporting retirement in 1987 than in 1981.
- \* Thirty-one percent fewer inactive nurses (218) gave "household responsibilities" as the reason they were inactive in 1987 than in 1981.

#### INTRODUCTION

This report has been prepared to graphically display a comparison of selected characteristics of Maine registered nurses in two given years: 1981 and 1987. The data upon which these graphs are based are available in two previously published reports: Maine Nurses - 1980, 1981, and Maine Nurses - 1987. These data were collected through the use of statewide mail surveys of all registered nurses who were licensed in Maine at specific points in time in those years (January 1, 1981 and/or July 1, 1987).

Statewide biennial surveys of licensed Maine nurses were conducted by the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics from 1976 through 1981 through contracts with the National Center for Health Statistics as part of a federal-state program designed to provide a minimum core of essential data in each state using the same definitions, measurements, and time periods. In 1981, funding for this system was withdrawn nationwide and as a result, data collection on the nursing profession was discontinued.

In 1985, through an amendment to the Law Regulating the Practice of Nursing, the Commission on Nursing Supply and Educational Accessibility was established. It is composed of fifteen persons appointed by the Governor, with two members representing the general public and thirteen members representing various nursing organizations and organizations or industries which are heavily involved with the nursing occupations. This commission was created by the Legislature with the intent that by 1995, or as soon as possible thereafter, and when the commission reports that all criteria have been met which will ensure the availability of nurses and that the educational needs of nurses throughout the state are met, the following will be implemented:

that there be two levels of nurses requiring either an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree; and

that provisions be made concerning educational requirements that take into consideration the protection of those currently licensed and the availability of nurses throughout the state.

As part of this legislation, the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics was mandated to provide data to the Commission. As a result, the Commission reviewed the survey instruments used in the 1981 data collection effort and requested that the surveys be re-implemented with some revisions (the core body of questions remain unchanged).

This report compares the data collected through the 1987 data collection effort with the 1981 data and has been prepared to assist the Commission and other interested individuals and groups (e.g., health planners, schools of nursing) in assessing changes within the profession. The data tables upon which the charts in this report are based may be found in Appendices 3 and 4.

#### TECHNICAL NOTES

#### Activity Levels

For the purposes of this report, nurses are considered active if they report working as a nurse for an average of one or more hours per week.

#### Commission on Nursing Supply and Educational Accessibility

This commission was created by the Legislature in 1985 and was mandated to address specific issues which would assure that certain criteria would be met before two levels of nursing practice are implemented in Maine. The Commission's legislative charge is:

- 1. to determine the educational accessibility of approved courses for both the associate and baccalaureate degree levels throughout the state;
- to determine the availability of education programs for upgrading all levels of nurses throughout the state;
- to determine the extent that credits are transferable between vocational-technical institutes and the university system and whether full credit for courses will be granted toward a baccalaureate degree:
- 4. to assess whether there will be a sufficient supply of both levels of nurses to meet the needs throughout the state if associate or baccalaureate degrees are required;
- to assess the extent to which there is access to assessment of prior learning of nursing knowledge and transferability of nursing credits throughout the state, including areas that are geographically underserved;
- 6. to determine which titles should be used by each level of nursing and how each level should be defined;
- 7. to determine whether competency testing should be required and whether certain educational requirements should be waived if new levels of education are implemented; and

8. to determine whether nurses coming in from other states will or should continue to have endorsement from the state and how this will affect the supply of nurses throughout the state.

#### Comparability with Earlier Data

Much of the data collected through the 1987 statewide survey of licensed registered (RN) nurses were also collected in 1981 through another statewide survey effort. Due to the fact that response rates between the two surveys vary greatly (RN in-state response was 91.9% in 1981 and 78.2% in 1987), the actual numbers of responses to any given item could not be compared from year to year. For that reason, an estimation procedure was developed and implemented for 1987 Maine resident RNs which allows for direct comparison between the two years (see Estimation Procedure).

#### Data Collection

From 1976 through 1981, the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics conducted biennial statewide surveys of Maine licensed registered nurses under federal contract with the National Center for Health Statistics. The survey instruments and methodology used for that data collection effort were reviewed by members of the Commission on Nursing Supply and Educational Accessibility to determine if the survey instrument collected data on the issues which the Commission was mandated to address and to determine if the methodology was still feasible.

The Commission members determined that the core body of questions from that survey gathered information which was important to the Commission in meeting their charge and that retention of those questions would allow for comparisons of the nursing professions with data collected in previous years. For those reasons, the core elements of the questionnaire (e.g., activity status, years active, number of patient care hours) are unchanged.

The earlier survey, however, did not address several items of particular interest to the Commission, e.g., reasons why inactive nurses stopped practicing, identification of incentives that would draw inactive nurses back into nursing. As a result, a number of new questions were added to the surveys to collect this information.

Previous methodology dictated that in January of each year, when re-licensure took place for the entire profession, surveys for this statewide data collection effort would be mailed with license renewal applications from the board of licensure; this insured a high response rate. But by 1987, the Board of Nursing had implemented staggered re-licensure cycles in which nurses license during their month of birth. Utilizing this mailing to collect data on Maine nurses would take a full year. The Commission requested that

the methodology be changed so that the surveys would be mailed independently of the licensing process in one bulk mailing and data could be collected for a particular point in time.

As a result, the Maine State Board of Nursing provided licensee lists of registered nurses (effective July 1, 1987) to this project in the late summer of 1987. All Maine licensed registered nurses were sent a mail survey from the Commission on Nursing Supply and Educational Accessibility in the fall of 1987. One follow-up mailing was undertaken in the winter. Then telephone follow-up was begun on Maine resident RN non-respondents but was discontinued due to costs, the difficulty in obtaining phone numbers and in reaching these nurses. All data collection procedures, including the initial mail out, mail follow-up, coding, editing, and telephone follow-up were performed by staff of the Office of Data, Research, and Vital Statistics.

#### Data Limitations

Survey information is provided by the licensee on a voluntary basis and is not, in general, further verified. Data presented in this report are thus subject to the usual limitations associated with the use of mail questionnaire data collection procedures.

After initial data collection procedures were completed, returned surveys were checked for accuracy and response rates were computed. A second mailing was undertaken to increase response rates. Telephone follow-up was then undertaken on a sample of Maine resident nurses to further increase in-state response.

As the result of telephone follow-up, a response rate of 78.2% was obtained on in-state RNs. As this response rate was still relatively low (compared to earlier years), an estimation procedure was developed for in-state RN non-respondents (see below). Using this procedure, an adjusted response rate of approximately 95% was obtained for Maine resident RNs, i.e., the characteristics of 78.2% of in-state nurses are known, the characteristics of 16.8% are estimated.

The tabulations from which these charts were developed are based on edited files which have been corrected for missing and erroneous information which came to light subsequent to initial data compilation; there are, therefore, some discrepancies with reports circulated prior to this publication. Data in earlier reports are superseded by the tabulations used for this report.

#### Estimation Procedure for Maine Resident Registered Nurse Non-respondents

After two mailings of the 1987 Survey of Registered Nurses (the initial survey mailing and one follow-up mailing), the overall response rate for the profession was too low to compare the characteristics of 1987 nurses to data collected in previous years. As a result, telephone follow-up was conducted on a sample of

#### Estimation Procedure for Maine Resident Registered Nurse Non-respondents (con't)

Maine resident non-respondents in order to increase in-state response. Through this effort, an in-state response rate of 78.2% was obtained.

As previous statewide survey efforts had yielded in-state response rates of 90.0% or greater, data were still not comparable between years. As a result, an estimation procedure was developed whereby the characteristics of Maine resident non-respondents could be described.

This was achieved by comparing the characteristics of telephone respondents (all of whom were Maine residents) to the characteristics of Maine resident mail respondents. Although the characteristics of telephone respondents and mail respondents were alike in several ways, e.g., age and weeks worked in Maine, they were not alike in several significant ways. Telephone respondents were more likely to be inactive and male (these differences were statistically significant) than were mail respondents.

As telephone respondents were selected from the pool of Maine resident mail non-respondents, we believe that the characteristics of the Maine resident non-respondents are more closely aligned to the characteristics of the telephone respondents. For that reason, the characteristics of Maine resident registered nurse non-respondents have been distributed proportionately to the distribution of those same characteristics in the telephone respondent population.

#### Response Rates

An over-all response rate of 75.9% for registered nurses (78.2% for Maine resident nurses) was obtained over the course of the data collection process. After data collection procedures were completed, data for Maine resident non-respondents were estimated which resulted in an adjusted in-state response rate of approximately 95%.


#### Rounding

As the 1987 registered nurse data displayed in this report are arrived at through an estimation process, fractional numbers occurred in some table cells. These fractions were rounded to the nearest whole number; as a result, the sum of county totals on one chart may not equal the sum of county totals on another chart.

Registered Nurses Licensed in Maine\* by County of Residence: 1981 and 1987



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
Chart 2

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

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

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



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

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

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

Active Registered Nurses in Maine\* by Basic Degree: 1981 and 1987



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

Active Registered Nurses in Maine\* by Total Hours Worked per Week:



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



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
