

MAINE STATE HARNESS RACING COMMISSION ANNUAL REPORT For Calendar Year 2017

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1. Executive Summary

The Maine State Harness Racing Commission was originally created by Public Law 1975, Chapter 771, and reconstituted in 1997 to its current structure of five public members appointed by the Governor. One member must be affiliated with agricultural fairs, one member must represent the public and three members must have knowledge of harness racing. Administrative support and staff are provided through the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, where there are three full time, three seasonal and two half time employees dedicated to the work of the Commission.

The Commission is responsible for rulemaking, adjudicating appeals of judge's decisions, licensing of participants, tracks and off-track betting facilities, and setting the race dates for the year. It meets approximately monthly. During 2017, the Commission submitted legislation to update its statutes, amended rules governing the use of medications and penalties and adjudicated 33 prohibited substance cases and four judges appeals.

Also during 2017, the Commission authorized, and the staff implemented, marketing efforts aimed at augmenting/complimenting current efforts undertaken by the Harness Racing Promotional Board, the Maine Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association, and The Maine Harness Horsemen's Association. Marketing efforts for 2017 focused on Facebook posts and ads, since these are very inexpensive, can be precisely targeted, and are the best avenue to reach certain demographics that traditional media is ineffective at. A pilot project to revive radio broadcasts of harness racing was implemented during 2017 as well. Races were broadcast at five pari-mutuel fairs and the Sire Stakes Finals in Scarborough. The Commission hopes to build on its 2017 efforts this year with an expanded social media marketing campaign, additional radio broadcasts and a series of special races and events.

2. Overview of Commission Operations and Actions

Annually, the Commission's staff engages in a series of oversight and support activities intended to ensure the integrity of the sport, promote fairness and participation, and enhance the economic viability of the industry. State Stewards and State Veterinarians are present overseeing races on every race day. Blood tests are drawn from two horses following each race, and sent for analysis at LGC Laboratories in Lexington, Kentucky to check for prohibited substances. Samples are also collected daily to check for blood concentrations of carbon dioxide to ensure that trainers are not trying to manipulate carbon dioxide levels through administration of sodium bicarbonate. Finally, the Commission's staff also obtains blood samples during out of competition testing to check for blood doping agents which are designed to increase the oxygen carrying capacity of the horse.

RULEMAKING

Title 8, Chapter 11, contains multiple mandates and/or authorizations for the conduct of agency rulemaking. The Commission currently operates under eleven separate chapters of rules. Keeping rules current with constantly evolving industry practices, issues and statutory mandates requires vigilance and frequent amendments.

Administrative rulemaking must be conducted in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedures Act pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 375. All of the Commission's rules are considered routine technical rules as defined under Title 5, Section 8071. Routine technical rules do not require legislative review prior to final agency adoption.

During calendar year 2017, the Commission adopted extensive amendments to two rule chapters— Chapter 11: Medications, Prohibited Substances and Testing, and Chapter 17: Rule Violations; Penalties.

GRANTING LICENSES AND AWARDING RACE DATES

The Commission is authorized to issue annual licenses to entities desiring to hold harness horse races in which wagering is allowed. It also oversees the issuance of race dates to the various racing venues and issues licenses for simulcasting and to off-track betting facilities. Finally, the Commission licenses horse owners, trainers, drivers, grooms and all other persons participating in harness horse racing, including pari-mutuel employees and race officials.

MAINE SIRE STAKES PROGRAM

The Commission also oversees Maine's Sire Stakes Program, which seeks to encourage the breeding of Standardbred racehorses in Maine. The program requires the registration of participating stallions and mares, and the resulting foals that will participate on the program. Revenues from both harness racing wagering profits and slot machine profits are designated—by statute—for the purpose of supplementing Sire Stakes race purses. Just under \$2 million was designated to the Sire Stakes purse supplement fund in 2017.

During 2017, the Commission staff once again helped organize and implement the Sire Stakes program in collaboration with the Maine Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association (MSBOA). The staff also took part in closing out the Sire Stakes season by attending the consolation draws and the 2 and 3-year old Sire Stakes Finals at Scarborough Downs.

The Commission is happy to report that the 2017 Sire Stakes Program was very successful. As in the past few years there has been a slight decline in the number of participants; however, the favorable purse structure makes the program popular.

Horses in the Sire Stakes events are tested for any prohibited substances as requested by the Sire Stakes Advisory Committee.

A special thank you goes out to each track for hosting, promoting and providing assistance to showcase the Maine Sire Stakes Program. Additionally, a sincere thank you goes to the breeders, owners, Advisory Committee and the MSBOA Board of Directors for all the support and help given to the Commission in carrying out its responsibilities.

MEDICATION/TESTING PROGRAMS

BLOOD TESTING PROGRAM

Test samples were analyzed by the LGC Science Inc. Laboratory located in Lexington, Kentucky, during the 2017 racing season. The laboratory analyses are performed under the direction of Dr. Richard Sams, Director of Science for LGC. Upon arrival at the lab, samples were analyzed to detect prohibited drugs or acceptable drugs that exceeded the permitted levels as stated in the Maine State Harness Racing rule book.

The LGC Science Inc. Laboratory is a parent company of HFL Sports Science, LTD, located in Fordham, United Kingdom. LGC Science Inc., LTD has over 40 years of continuous experience in the science of drug testing. Initial screening of samples is done primarily using either gas or liquid chromatography coupled with mass spectrometry. These dual instrument methods allow for greater confidence in analyte identification. Confirmatory tests generally utilize the same instrumentation, but the method is refined to target the specific analyte in question.

During the 2017 racing year, 3,657 equine blood samples were taken. Of that total, 33 were found to be in violation of the Commission's rules.

OUT OF COMPETITION TESTING PROGRAM

In 2008, the Commission requested the staff test for "blood doping" agents, such as erythropoietin (EPO). This procedure requires taking blood from the horses at the tracks and training centers on days when the horse is not scheduled to race, refrigerating the blood, and transferring it to the LGC Science Lab for analysis. In 2017, there were 17 horses tested out of competition, none of which were found to be in violation.

BLOOD GAS TESTING PROGRAM

The Blood Gas Testing Program was established in 1993 at the request of the Commission. The program requires taking blood from horses shortly before they are scheduled to race, refrigerating the blood, and transferring it to LGC Science Lab for analysis. In 2017, 373 samples were taken pre-race to test for blood gas use. Out of the 373 tests, none were found in violation of the Blood Gas Testing Program.

FUROSEMIDE PROGRAM

The Furosemide Program, formally known as the Controlled Medication Program, was established in 1992 by statute. The program allows tolerances for horses that use phenylbutazone and Lasix. The Commission voted to eliminate phenylbutazone from the Controlled Medication Program during the Commission meeting that was held in June 2014. Consequently, the program now provides for on-site administration of Lasix only by the Commission's veterinarian on race day. There were 521 horses participating in this program in 2017. Throughout the year 31 horses went off the program.

HUMAN DRUG TESTING PROGRAM

The Human Drug Testing Program was created in order to test anyone with a Maine State Harness Racing license while in the paddock on race day. This program was designed to ensure the safety of the licensees and horses, on and off the track. Urine was collected by the State Stewards and was sent to the Department of Health and Human Services, Health and Environmental Testing Laboratory for analysis.

In the 2017 racing season, 61 drug tests were administered. Of the 61 samples collected there was one licensee in violation of the Commission's rules.

SUMMARY OF FINES AND SUSPENSIONS

During the 2017 racing year, there were on-track 67 violations of racing laws and rules.

3. Practical Effect of Title 8, Chapter 11 and Recommended Legislation

Title 8, Chapter 11 establishes the State Harness Racing Commission and provides statutory authority for the oversight and regulation of harness racing in the state. It affords for the licensing of participants, tracks and off-track betting facilities, and for the allocation of race dates between the various racing venues. Chapter 11 contains extensive rulemaking authority for the Commission which has resulted in the promulgation of eleven chapters of rules.

In general, Chapter 11 provides adequate authority to regulate and support Maine's harness racing industry. However, in an effort to keep pace with changing times, Maine's harness racing statutes have also been amended multiple times over the last two legislative sessions, and one bill—LD 1766—is currently pending before the Legislature. While the need for additional changes is likely to arise in the coming years, no further changes are recommended at this time.

4. **Report on the Commission's Financial Position**

The Commission derives its operating budget from three revenue sources as follows:

1. The Department's share from the commission on harness racing wagering profits;

- 2. Licensing fees associated with racing participants, tracks, race dates and off-track betting facilities; and
- 3. To the degree necessary to remain solvent, periodic administrative assessments against revenue allocated pursuant to Title 8, Section 1036, Subsection 2, paragraphs B, C, D, H and I.

The Commission essentially operates a zero-sum budget, insomuch as it attempts to make administrative assessments in a manner that ensures that revenues are approximately equal to expenditures by year end. A small amount of carryover is a necessary component of the calculations since dedicated accounts should never show a negative balance. The table below summarizes the Commissions Financial Position for calendar year 2017.

8. Use of Funds by Commercial Tracks (pursuant to 8 MRS § 1037(1))

There were two (2) licensed pari-mutuel facilities that met the definition of a Commercial Race Track pursuant to 8 MRS Section 275-A. One is located in Scarborough and the other in Bangor.

Davric Maine Corporation, DBA Scarborough Downs conducted 82 days of live racing offering wagering on 758 dashes and HC Bangor LLC, DBA Hollywood Casino Hotel & Raceway conducted 49 days of live racing and offered wagering on 427 dashes to the Off-track Betting facilities in Maine as well as out-of-state. Both facilities were licensed to accept pari mutuel wagers on simulcast races for 363 days.

The revenues received from the Fund To Encourage Racing At Maine's Commercial Tracks were used by the recipients to defray expenses incurred in conducting live racing and accepting pair mutuel wagers throughout the licensing year.
