I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the Maine harness racing industry this past year.

We have entered a new age of Maine racing, and I look forward to working with the industry leaders to tighten our regulatory programs and improve the testing and detection programs.

The Commission saw three off-track betting facilities change hands during the year. John Martin's Manor was sold to Autotote Enterprises, Inc.; Miller's Restaurant was sold to Bangor Historic Track, Inc.; and Step Two OTB was sold to Sharon Terry and George Kerr, Jr. (OTB Facilitators). We will miss the Millers, Peter Martin and Tony Palminteri, for they were outstanding leaders in their field and were very helpful in the campaign to get the racino legislation enacted. We welcome the new owners and look forward to working with them in the future.

Bangor Historic Track, Inc. has renovated the Millers Restaurant for its racino operation and has completely renovated the area under the Bass Park grandstand for its OTB operation. Starting in 2006, Bangor Historic Track, Inc. will operate as an inter-track wagering facility rather than as an off- track betting facility.

The racino operation began on November 4, 2005, and has generated additional dollars that were distributed in January to the fairs, commercial tracks, OTB's and put money aside for the Sire Stakes program. The purse supplement funds have also been distributed to the licensed live racetracks for the 2006 race season.

I look forward to working with our staff, industry leaders and the Department in making our racing the best in the Northeast.

On behalf of the Commission, I wish everyone in our industry a very successful 2006.

First let me thank all those in our sport for making 2005 a very successful year. Unfortunately, we continue to experience slight drops in our handle as evidenced in 2005with a decrease of 5.6%. The decrease is attributable to several factors, weather being one, and the closing of Millers Restaurant and the delay in opening the new OTB under the grandstand at Bass Park. Again, in 2004 we did not experience a horse supply problem due to the cooperation with track managements. The industry continued to sponsor abbreviated series with great success. The credit for these Series goes to the Promotional Board and the hosting tracks. I applaud this effort for it exhibited that the industry does work together to better itself using its own dollars.

The long awaited revenue stream from the slots in Bangor began pouring in on November 4, 2005. Hollywood Slots opened with 475 machines in operation. There was \$1,990,214.32 forwarded to the State for distribution to the various Funds from a total of \$60, 270,754.91 being put through the machines in November and December.

This past year the staff spent months involved in suitability studies for the new owners of Millers Restaurant (Bangor Historic Track Inc.), John Martins Manor Restaurant (Autotote Enterprises Inc.) Step Two LLC (OTB Facilitators). These duties were in addition to our ongoing work with the tracks, organizations and other racing jurisdictions throughout North America.

I would like to thank the Department's leaders (Former Commissioner Spear, and Acting Commissioner and Deputy Commissioner Ned Porter) the Commission members, my staff, and all those in our industry for the support, patience and participation in our great sport. This coming year we will be faced with new challenges; yet, with our ongoing cooperative spirit we will be able to face those challenges and strengthen our industry.

I look forward to working with Commissioner Bradstreet, the Commission members, the various organizations and individuals this coming racing year.

DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION

The Maine Harness Racing Commission was created by the Maine legislature to exercise and maintain a proper control over harness racing in Maine for the good of the sport and all persons involved in it and for the good of the state. The Commission's duties include building public trust and maintaining a high level of integrity in all aspects of harness racing.

The Commission is empowered by the State of Maine to establish and enforce rules of conduct for harness horse races, race tracks, wagering and off-track betting. The Commission is required by law to protect the health, safety and welfare of all race participants, of standardbred horses, of spectators and the wagering public.

The work is the basis for the betterment and promotion of harness racing in Maine and for the continued development of Maine's standardbred horses program.

The Commission derives its statutory authority from Maine's harness Racing Laws, contained in Title 8, Chapter 11 of the Maine Revised Statutes. The Commission's principal responsibilities include oversight of harness racing, simulcast racing and off-track betting and support of the Maine standardbred horse program.

To accomplish these responsibilities, the Commission has licensing, enforcement and supervisory authority and the duty to establish rules of conduct for the holding, conducting and operating of race tracks on which any such race or meet is held and for the conduct on the race track of all persons participating in harness horse racing [8 MRSA & 268 and 279-A].

The Commission may license any person, association or corporation desiring to hold a harness horse race or meet for public exhibition, including the issuance of race dates (with or without pari-mutuel pools); interstate simulcast racing at a licensee's track during any regular meeting; pari-mutuel wagering at an off-track betting facility; and owners, trainers, drivers, grooms and all other persons participating in harness horse racing, including pari-mutuel employees and race officials. [8MRSA & 268, 269, 270, 271, 274-A & 279-A].

The Commission has the power and authority to regulate, supervise and check the making of pari-mutuel pools and the distribution therefrom; to investigate the ownership and control of any licensee; to investigate any suspected violations of the law or rules; and to supervise and regulate all medication administered to horses entered to race. [8 MRSA &279-B].

The Commission is authorized to establish a schedule of fines and suspensions and to levy fines and suspensions for violations of the harness racing laws or rules. [8 MRSA & 279-B].

The Commission also has the responsibility to encourage and promote the breeding of a strain of Maine standardbred horses and make provision to encourage donations of the same by licensees or others to persons or institutions within the State for breeding purposes. The Commission has the authority to establish fees and maintain a fund, the Sire Stakes Fund, for establishment of a Maine Standardbred horses program. [8 MRSA & 281].

The Commission Members

The Maine Harness Racing Commission consists of five members appointed by the governor to provide broad geographic representation. The appointments are subject to review by the Joint Standing Committee on Agriculture and to confirmation by the Maine State Senate.

One of the Commission's members is appointed as Chair. The members serve threeyear terms, but they remain in their posts until their successors are appointed. One must be affiliated with an agricultural fair. Three members must have knowledge of harness racing.

People appointed to fill any vacancies that occur, serve for the remainder of the unexpired term of the vacancy.

George McHale of Orrington, Chair

Mr. McHale, originally from New York, started his stellar broadcasting career in the Navy during the Korean War. Following training in New York, he accepted positions in Bangor, ME, becoming the "Voice" of the University of Maine Black Bears in football, baseball, and basketball. In addition, he has covered high school sporting events from one end of the state to the other, always lending his trusted voice of authority at "Tourney Time." His awards include being a member of the Maine Broadcasters' Hall of Fame and Maine Sportscaster of the Year twice. He has been a fixture of the harness racing community for more than 20 years, "calling" races and acting as Chair of the Maine Harness Racing Commission for nine years prior to this present appointment.

James Tracy of Farmingdale

Mr. Tracy graduated from Gardiner High School in 1955. He has worked in the banking industry for over 36 years. He has been the Treasurer of Windsor Fair for 16 years and has been instrumental in the development of Windsor Fair, serving in a variety of capacities over the past 36 years. His term will expire in 2007.

Norman Trask of Presque Isle

Mr. Trask graduated from Maranacook Community School in 1981, from the University of Maine, Presque Isle in 1985, and the University of Maine Law School in Portland in 1988. Mr. Trask has a law practice in Presque Isle and has been active in harness racing for over a decade. His term will expire in 2005.

Stan Kuklinski of Farmington

Mr. Kuklinski graduated from high school in Utica, New York in 1958 and attended Utica College. Mr. Kuklinski comes from three generations of dairy farmers, has owned a horse stable in Farmington, and has participated in harness racing as an owner and breeder. He is currently a developer and builder in the greater Farmington area, is a life-certified tennis professional, and assists people in this sporting area whenever time permits. His term will expire in 2006.

Anne Jordan of South Portland

Ms. Jordan graduated from Kennebunk High School in 1977, the University of Southern Maine in 1981, and the University of Maine Law School in 1984. Ms. Jordan served as an assistant district attorney from 1984 to 1990, after which she entered private practice. She is currently the chair of the State of Maine Pardons' Board and Vice-Chair of the Animal Welfare Board. Her term will expire in 2006.

The Commission Staff

The Maine Harness Racing Commission is represented in its Augusta office and in the field by a well qualified, hard-working staff of employees and contractors. These people are the key to the success of harness racing in Maine. MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION

The Commission is required by statute to meet at least monthly. Three of the five members of the Commission constitute a quorum to do business. A record is kept of all proceedings of the Commission.

A majority of the Commission meetings involve hearings on violations of the medication or banned substances rules and hearings of appeals from judges; decisions regarding racing violations. The Chair of the Commission, acting as a sole hearing authority, conducts hearings on minor violations of the rules. The remainder of the Commission's meetings are used for rule-making activities and for licensing issues.

Although only twelve monthly meetings are required by statute, the Commission has found it necessary to hold several meetings each month in order to meet the expanding work load. Increasingly complex adjudicatory hearings, licensing hearings, both for live racing and for off-track betting facilities, and rule making have created a demanding work schedule for the Commission. The Commission met a total of 15 times during calendar year 2005.

The majority of the Commission meetings are held in Augusta, either at the State Office Building or at another location by announcement. Occasionally the Commission will meet in Scarborough or in Bangor to facilitate attendance of people from those areas who might otherwise not be able to attend Commission meetings.

A published agenda of all Commission meetings is available ten days prior to each meeting. You may obtain a copy by contacting the Commission office in Augusta or by requesting to be placed on the agenda mailing list.

Commission Offices

The Commission is required by statute to maintain an office in Augusta. During the time in which racing is conducted in the state, the Commission is authorized to maintain branch offices throughout the state.

Rulemaking

The Commission is authorized by statute to promulgate the rules necessary to carry out and enforce Maine's harness racing laws. In addition, it has authority to establish rules of practice governing the conduct of adjudicatory proceedings, licensing proceedings and the rendering of advisory rulings. Agency rulemaking is governed by the Maine Administrative Procedures Act found in Title 5, chapter 375 of the Maine Harness Racing commission rule book.

Maine law requires that the Commission "provide a booklet containing harness racing laws and rules and relevant portions of the Maine Administrative Procedure Act to every initial licensee and a fee not to exceed \$10.00 must be included in the license fee to cover the cost of this publication. The Commission shall provide necessary revisions of this booklet to those persons renewing licenses at the time of renewal and shall include the cost of revisions, not to exceed \$10.00, in the renewal fee."

Commission rulemaking in 2001 resulted in the publishing of a new rule book in July of 2002. The Commission continually updates rules to meet the needs of the industry. In 2006, the Commission will focus on updating rules concerning the Sires Stakes and rules of racing.

The Commission acknowledges the support and contributions of the many members of the harness racing community as well as the public and offers thanks for their assistance.



GRANTING LICENSES AND AWARDING RACE DATES

The Commission is authorized to issue annual licenses to any person, association or corporation desiring to hold a harness horse race or meet for public exhibition, including the issuance of race dates pari-mutuel pools; interstate simulcast racing at a licensee's race track during any regular meeting; pari-mutuel wagering at an off-track betting facility; and owners, trainers, drivers, grooms and all other persons participating in harness horse racing, including pari-mutuel employees and race officials.

Medication/Testing Program

Urine and Blood Program

Test samples were analyzed by the State of Maine Health & Environmental Testing Laboratory located in Augusta, Maine. In some cases the State Lab has used the Maryland Public Health Laboratory, Cornell University Laboratory and the American Medical Association Laboratory to supplement testing of urine samples and/or to accommodate split samples requests by licensees.

Each blood and urine sample received by the laboratory is screened by specialized tests to comply with the ARCI-QAP guidelines for drug detection. These tests include specific extraction procedures, Thin Layer Chromatography (TLC), and Enzyme-Linked Immunosorbent Assays (ELISA).

If screening tests indicate the presence of a drug or unknown foreign substance in a sample, additional specialized testing is performed on that individual sample to prove or disprove the initial findings. All findings are unequivocally confirmed by the use of such techniques as Gas Chromatography, Mass Spectrometry as well as High Pressure Liquid Chromatography (HPLC).



Maine allows the use of phenylbutazone (bute) and furosemide (lasix) in horses under direction of the Controlled Medication Program. The laboratory monitors these two drugs in all equine samples received.

During the 2005 racing year, 2,297 equine urine samples and 95 blood samples were taken. Of the total 2,392 tests taken,8 were in violation of the Commission's rules.

Also in the 2005 racing year, 151 human urine samples were taken. Of the total tests taken, 2 samples were found to be positive.

Violations

2. Blood Gas Program

The Blood Gas Testing Program was established in 1993 at the request of the Commission. The program requires blood to be taken from the horses at various tracks, refrigerated, and transferred to the Health Environmental Testing laboratory for analysis.

In 2005, the blood gas testing results indicated the following: of the 3,834 horses tested, 3,828 tested within acceptable limits, and 6 horses tested positive for violation of a banned substance.

3. Controlled Medication Program

The Controlled Medication Program was established in 1992 by statute and allows tolerances for horses who use phenylbutazone and lasix. The program is an on site program and is under the direction of the Commission veterinarian.

80 horses withdrew from the program at various times during the year

The above funds are collected in the Harness Racing Commission office and are deposited in the appropriate accounts in compliance with 8 RSA, Section 286.

General Fund monies are used to support the activities of the Commission. The amounts credited to the General Fund from wagers that exceed \$35 million are credited to the Commercial Meet Stipend Fund. Seventy-two (72) percent of these funds are distributed to the licensed commercial tracks in proportion to the live wagers placed at their facility to the total wagers placed at all commercial licensees. One-half of the amounts are used to supplement purses and the other one-half is used to reimburse facilities for capital expenditures approved by the Commission. Ten percent is retained in the General Fund; nine percent is transferred to the Sire Stakes Fund; and, nine percent is transferred to the Agricultural Fair Stipend Fund.

Agricultural Fair Stipend Fund monies are distributed to those fairs licensed by the Department in accordance with 7 MRSA, Section 62.

Extended Meet Stipend Fund monies come from the Agricultural Fair Stipend Fund. Eighty (80) percent of any funds that exceed the \$400,000.00 cap are distributed to those licensed tracks that conduct a race meet not in conjunction with an agricultural fair. The distribution is based on the proportion of a track's live wagers to the total live wagers made at all extended meets.

Depositing five (5) percent of those monies credited to the General Fund creates the Fair Stipend Fund. These contributions are used to supplement the premiums paid by agricultural fairs during their annual exhibition.

Sire Stakes Fund monies are used to support purses for the Maine Standardbred Breeders Stakes races, to promote the Sire Stakes Program and to cover any expenses incurred in managing this program.


Promotional Board Fund monies are used to support the activities of the Maine Harness Racing Promotional Board. This organization is an independent instrumentality of the State which hires its own executive director and is responsible for its own budget.

Purse Supplement Fund monies are used to supplement purses at all licensed live racing facilities. The funds are distributed based on the number of days raced by a licensee in proportion to the total number of days raced by all licensees.

Off Track Betting Simulcast Fund monies are distributed to those licensed commercial and agricultural fairs that provide a signal of their races to Maine's licensed off track betting facilities. The funds are distributed based on a licensee's exotic wagers at the off track betting facilities in proportion to the total of all licensees' exotic wagers at the off track betting facilities.

OFF TRACK BETTING REPORT

In 1991 the Maine Legislature enacted legislation that allowed Commercial Tracks licensed by the Maine Harness Racing Commission to apply for and be licensed to operate Off Track Betting Facilities. In 1993 the Maine Legislature amended the statutes to allow Class A Restaurants to apply for and be licensed by the Maine Harness Racing Commission to operate Off Track Betting Facilities. That year there were three applicants that were awarded licenses to operate Off Track Betting Facilities.

Through February, 1996 there were a total of seven successful applicants to operate Off Track Betting Facilities: John Martin's Manor, Waterville; Spare Time Recreation, Lewiston; Champs Teletheatre, Presque Isle; Miller's Restaurant, Bangor; Jackie's Bar and Grill, Madawaska; Sagtuck, Inc. DBA Winner's OTB, Brunswick; and, Bath House of Pizza and Seafood Restaurant DBA Lower Deck OTB, Bath.

In 2005 there were five (5) OTBs licensed to operate in Maine: John Martin's Manor, Waterville; Lewiston Raceway, Lewiston; Miller's Restaurant, Bangor; Sagtuck Inc. DBA Winner's OTB, Brunswick; and, Main View LLC, DBA Pat's Pizza, Step Two LLC, Sanford. During the calendar year there were three sold: John Martin's Manor to Autotote Enterprises Inc.; Miller's Restaurant to Bangor Historic Track, Inc.; and, Step Two LLC to Sharon Terry and George Kerr, Jr.

The total interstate wagering handle recorded by the OTBs in 2004 was \$36,840,441 or a 5.0% decrease from 2003. The total intrastate wagering handle recorded by the OTBs was 1,371,954 or a 5.2% increase from 2002. The individual wagering information can be found in Part IV, ANNUAL REPORT of the Maine Harness Racing Commission. The revenues to the various Funds from these wagers are as follows:

The Off Track Betting Facilities' share of the total handle is 56.46%. This is a decrease of 1.80% from the OTB share in 2003. This decrease continues the trend set in 2002 and is the result of the continuing increase in inter-track wagering at Scarborough Downs, and for 2004 an increase for the first time in years for live racing wagers.

Activities for 2005

HARNESS RACING PROMOTIONAL BOARD

ORIGIN OF THE BOARD

The Harness Racing Promotional Board was established in 1993 under Public Law Chapter 388 and later changed in 1997 by Public Law Chapter 528 to promote harness racing activities and increase participation in racing and wagering in the State of Maine.

The Board is comprised of nine members and two alternates, appointed by the Commissioner of Agriculture. These members represent various components of the industry, and terms are staggered for historic retention. Two members represent the Standardbred Breeders, one member serves as a representative from Scarborough Downs, and one represents Bangor Raceway. The harness horsemen, the agricultural fairs, and the off-track betting parlors each have a representative, and two members represent the interested public. Two alternates are also appointed on an annual basis, and they attend and participate in discussions and business decisions of the Board.

ACTIVITIES OF THE BOARD IN 2005

In 2005, the Board once again operated with oversight assistance from the Department of Agriculture and extensive participation by the Board members to carry out various promotion programs.

Television advertising was again the choice of the Board for their major promotion project, and this was carried out through various television networks and aimed at the younger members of the public. Local cable channels were included in the advertising this year, but the consensus of the Board was that we need to return to the major channels for future advertising. The advertising of live harness racing at the commercial tracks and the pari-mutuel fairs was updated as the season progressed, and we hope that this will be improved upon in 2006.

In January of 2005, the Board was again a participant at the Northeast Horsemen's Conference and the Maine Agricultural show at the Augusta Civic Center. Hundreds of interested persons stopped at the booth to discuss the industry and to express their views on recent happenings that concerned the harness racing industry. Much of our information concerned the racino issue and legislation that was pending concerning the industry. We distributed our annual calendars and other pertinent information. The Board believes that a booth at these events is an absolute necessity.

The Board again staffed a booth at the annual meeting of the Maine Association of Agricultural Fairs, which is held at the end of January in Portland; it was noted that the fairs are very interested in the promotion of harness racing in Maine. Both the pari-mutuel fairs and the non-pari-mutuel fairs benefit from the stipend funds provided from our industry, and some smaller fairs might not survive without these funds.

During the Legislative Day at the State House, members manned a booth and distributed information including written materials to members of the Legislature, the employees, and many others. Again, there was a great deal of interest in recent developments and pending legislation for 2005.

As has been done traditionally, a racing series was sponsored at the agricultural fairs, and members of the Board were present to participate in the Winner's Circle presentations.

The Board contributed up to \$45 per day for an individual to submit to newspapers the entries and results for the racing programs for the fairs this year, enabling more newspapers to cover the live racing programs than ever before. This was an added plus for live racing and its fans.

We continued distribution of our remaining tee shirts with the "Fun to the Finish" logo.

Our educational materials and booth appeared at various locations throughout the year in conjunction with the agricultural fair displays and contained new photos and information for the public. Transporting the materials used has become a joint effort of the Board and the Department.

Sub-committees of the board worked on advertising, the 2006 calendar contest, sale of advertising, statistics, budgets, and other relevant promotional ideas. Door prizes were furnished to the annual horsemen's meetings to aid their scholarship funds.

The Board continues to meet on a monthly basis usually in Augusta. During 2005, however, some meetings were held at various racing locations.

The changes facing harness racing seem to be never ending. With patience, cooperation of the various players in this industry, and the support of loyal fans and the public, we think the future looks brighter for harness racing in Maine.



On November 4, 2005, Penn National Gaming, Inc./ Bangor Historic Track, Inc. opened Hollywood Slots to the public for operations. It had been just two years since the people of Maine approved the operation of slots at licensed commercial harness racing tracks. The City of Bangor had granted approval through a citywide vote in June of 2003.

The racino did a little better than expected through the first two months of operation.

The funds generated were disbursed in January and February to the racetracks, OTB's and agricultural fairs.

The racino facility is located in the former Millers Restaurant on Main Street in Bangor approximately 2000 feet from the racetrack. The OTB that was operated by Millers is now located in the grandstand of the Bangor Raceway. The racino opened with 475 machines licensed and operational.

Penn National Gaming, Inc. is in the process of acquiring additional property to build a new facility that will be capable of operating 1500 machines.

We wish Hollywood Slots the best of luck throughout 2006.

Total amount reported going through the machines was \$60,270,754.91. The 39% of the net revenue going to the State fro distribution was \$1,387,506.77.

The Gambling Control Board's share is used for administration of the racino program.

The Agricultural Fair Support Fund share is used as follows: 34% is distributed to the live race tracks in proportion to the number of dashes conducted each track to the total number of dashes raced by all race tracks. 66% is distributed to each licensed agricultural fair in proportion to the amount of premiums paid by each licensee to the total amount of premiums paid by all licensed agricultural fairs.

The Sire Stakes Fund is used to support purses for the two and three year old stakes races conducted at the racetracks.

The Fund to Encourage Racing at Maine's Commercial Tracks is distributed to those licensed racetracks pursuant to 8 MRSA Section 271.

OTB Stabilization Fund is distributed to those licensed off track betting facilities that are operating at the time the funds are distributed.

The General Fund revenues are used for administrative expenses of the Gambling Control Board including gambling addiction counseling services established by rule.

The Fund for a Healthy Maine are to be used as outlined in Title 22 Section 1511.6.E.

The University of Maine System Scholarship Fund revenues are to be used as scholarships for individuals attending one of the institutions of the UMS.

The Maine Community College Scholarship Fund revenues are to be used as scholarships for individuals attending one of Maine's Community Colleges.

The Licensee must forward 1% to the municipality in which the slots are located. In this instance the City of Bangor is the recipient of those funds.

The 2005 Annual Report of the Maine Sire Stakes Program consists of a narrative overview, financial information, purses paid, statistical information of the eligible participants, and final point standings.

For the past few years, I have assigned the on site operation of the sire stakes program to Ralph Canney, Program Manager for Live Racing Activities. I have first hand knowledge that it is not easy to ensure the rules are fairly and properly interpreted as to the eligibility of horses participating in the Maine Sire Stakes Program. Further, it is an ongoing job of tracking the changes in ownership, trainers or partnerships formed throughout the racing season. Ralph traveled to each racing venue to provide continuity to the drawing of the Sire Stakes races and did an excellent job in keeping the racing officials aware of those changes. I wish to thank Ralph and those who assisted him for doing an excellent job in 2005.

In my opinion the 2005 stakes program was very successful. Again the numbers did not reflect the enthusiasm exhibited by the owners and our racing fans. The number of non-betting races were up due to fewer horses being sustained to the program. We experienced a decrease, again, in the wagering handle for 2005. It was a slight dip; however, any loss of wagers affects all harness racing programs. Our program continues to be showcased throughout Maine via the five Off Track Betting establishments and Scarborough Downs.

As in years past, the Sire Stakes Advisory Committee recommended to the Commission that entrants to sire stakes events be tested to determine if an alkalinizing agent had been administered. The Committee recommended, and the Commission approved, that up to \$10,000.00 be made available to defray the costs of testing for the alkalinizing agent.

A special thank you goes to each track for hosting and making an effort to promote and provide assistance to showcase our program. Special thanks go to the breeders, owners, Advisory Committee and the MSBOA Board of Directors for all the support and help given us in carrying out our responsibilities.

In November the long awaited opening of the slot portion of the Bangor Racino became a reality. The projections have exceeded the actual numbers through the end of January. I expect the amount of money available to the sire stakes program to be \$700,000 for calendar year 2006. An exciting time lies ahead for Maine's harness racing industry

I look forward to working with all of you in the future and hope we continue to make the program better. On behalf of the Commission and the Department I wish each of you success and good racing in 2006.
