- Risk free compliance assistance under the Small Business Compliance Assistance Policy (SBCIP)

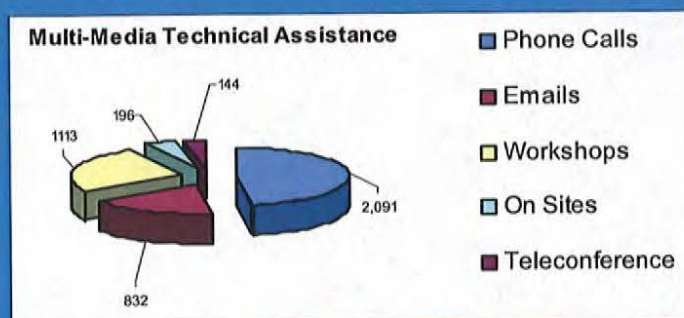

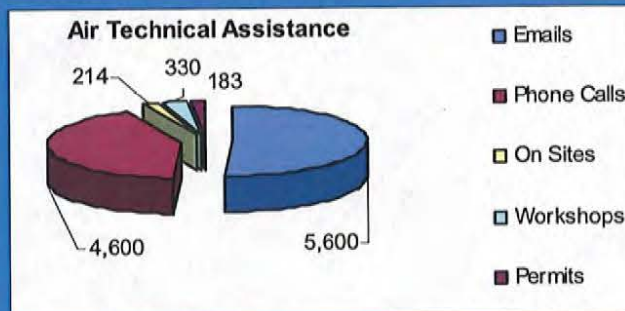
