I have attached the periodic status report prepared by DEP's Technical and Environmental Assistance Program (Office of Innovation). This report covers the work completed during 2007 to support Maine small businesses and to encourage pollution prevention, including continual environmental improvements.

We are particularly pleased with our success at providing:

- 168 direct on-site visits focused on lowering environmental and global warming impacts while advocating increased sustainability;
- Ongoing growth and technical assistance in all of the Environmental Leader programs including the Governor's Carbon Challenge Program, Green Lodging Certification, Green Restaurant Certification, and Smart Growth through Smart Production:
- Certifying 71 lodging establishments under the Green Lodging Certification program and 15 restaurants under the Green Restaurant Certification program as Environmental Leaders:
- Holding a successful Governor's Carbon Challenge conference with over 150 attendees that recognized and awarded 20 facilities who achieved greater than a 10% reduction in carbon emissions; and
- Leading the Clean Government Initiative and implementing State procurement of environmentally friendly commodities and services, as assessed on a life cycle basis. These include cleaning chemicals, electronics, lights, uniforms and paper.

We have formatted this report to provide succinct, meaningful information regarding our programs by including graphics and charts. We intend to use this report as an education and outreach tool for a variety of audiences.
