I have attached the 2010 periodic status report prepared by DEP's Office of Innovation & Assistance Technical and Environmental Assistance Program pursuant to 38 MRSA, Section 343-C, sub-section 2 (B). This report covers the work completed during 2009 to support Maine small businesses and to encourage pollution prevention, including continual environmental improvements.

We are particularly pleased with our success over the past year, including:

- 68 direct on-site visits focused on lowering environmental and global warming impacts while advocating increased sustainability;
- Over 2,000 assistance related emails and phone calls;
- Ongoing growth and technical assistance in all of the Environmental Leader programs, including the Governor's Carbon Challenge Program, Green Lodging Certification, Green Restaurant Certification, and Green Grocery Stores;
- Certifying 108 lodging establishments under the Green Lodging Certification program and 26 restaurants under the Green Restaurant Certification program as Environmental Leaders;
- Modernizing the Toxic Use Reduction Program: LD 1423; and
- Leading the Clean Government Initiative established in 2001 under 38 MRSA, Section 343-H and implementing State procurement of environmentally friendly commodities and services, as assessed on a life cycle basis, including cleaning chemicals, electronics, lights, uniforms and paper.

We have formatted this report to provide succinct, meaningful information regarding our programs by including graphics and charts. We intend to use this report as an education and outreach tool for a variety of audiences.



LD 1423: Modernize Toxic Use Reduction Program

- LD1423 will repeal existing TURA by 2012
- Collaborative stakeholders process representing industry, labor, environmental & public health, and government
- · Shift focus to use of priority toxic chemicals: lower threshold
- Listings based on threat to human health, environment, and workers;
 usage in Maine; and availability of safer alternatives
- DEP rulemaking by July 2011 and every 3 years thereafter
- Up to 10 chemicals on first list
- Technical Assistance to reduce use of priority toxic chemicals by Maine businesses
