

JOINT STANDING COMMITTEE ON MARINE RESOURCES LEGISLATION 111th Legislature, First Regular Session

BANKING SPONSOR DISPOSITION ID TITLE SPONSOR DISPOSITION 37 AN ACT CONCERNING CONFIDENTIAL-ITY OF FISHERIES STATISTICS Crowley ENACT. PL 9

SUMMARY: Authorizes the Commissioner of Maine Resources, with the advice and consent of the Advisory Council, to adopt rules to provide confidential treatment to fisheries statistics. The bill makes state provisions similar to federal law.

158 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A MINIMUM Dillenback LV/WD 2-INCH SIZE LIMIT ON SOFT SHELL CLAMS

SUMMARY: This bill would have established a 2" minimum size limit on the taking of soft shell clams. The purpose of the limit is to conserve the resouce. Subcommittee hearings were held in Millbridge, Rockland, and Freeport. Public reaction to the proposed was highly mixed. For this reason, the committee will do a study of clam conservation measures this summer, and report its recommendations at the start of the next session.

177 AN ACT RELATING TO THE USE OF Brown, L LV/WD ARTIFICIAL LIGHTS IN HERRING FISHING

- 183 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE SARDINE Salsbury OTP-ND INSPECTION TAX
- SUMMARY: Enacted in new draft as LD 1117 (c. 116). This bill, to take effect June 1, 1983, authorizes the Maine Sardine Council to raise the sardine tax from 12 cents up to a maximum of 20 cents per case. This increase was determined necessary to maintain the present sardine inspection program administered by the Department of Agriculture.

185 AN ACT CONCERNING THE SARDINE Vose LV/WD TAX

209 AN ACT CONCERNING THE USE OF Scarpino OTP-ND PURSE SEINES IN WASHINGTON COUNTY

SUMMARY: Enacted in new draft as LD 1214 (c.). Several bills dealt with gear conflicts between purse seiners and fish weir fishermen this session. In its original form, this bill would have repealed the requirement that the Commissioner of Marine Resources determine that purse seining will not create a hardship to fixed gear fishermen or unduly deplete the resource before allowing purse seining in Washington County. The final bill repealed this, and also charged the closed season from April 10 through October 15th to April 15th through September 30th. This is a compromise of between the positions advocated by the fixed and mobile gear fishermen.

- 210 AN ACT TO ALLOW THE USE OF Scarpino LV/WD PURSE SEINES IN WASHINGTON COUNTY
- 211 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A Conners OTP-ND REDUCED FEE FOR LOBSTER FISHING LICENSES FOR PER-SONS 70 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER
- SUMMARY: Would have provided reduced lobster license fees for persons over 70. The bill died on the appropriations table.
- 275 AN ACT TO AMEND THE MAINE Vose LV/WD SARDINE LAW
- 336 AN ACT TO PROHIBIT POSSESSION Salsbury ENACT. PL 52 OF LOBSTERS BY SCALLOP BOATS
- SUMMARY: Prohibits taking lobsters with scallop drag, or possessing lobsters on a boat rigged for scallop dragging.
- 501 AN ACT TO LIMIT SCALLOP Randall LV/WD DRAGGING
- 502 AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE Carter AUTHORITY OF THE COMMIS-SIGNER OF MARINE RESOURCES REGARDING FISHWAYS
