Barbers & Cosmetologists

352	AN ACT TO PERMIT BARBERS TO CUT HAIR OUTSIDE OF BARBER SHOPS	DEXTER	(OTPA-9) (CNTP-4) PL 1983, c.339

- SUMMARY: Allows barbers, like cosmetologists, to practice the trade upon a person in the person's residence.
- COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" (H-215): Requires that in order to practice at persons' homes, the barber must maintain or be employed in a licensed shop; allows board to prescribe rules for the practice in homes. (ADOPTED)
- 430 AN ACT TO PROVIDE REPRESENT- MINKOWSKY LV/WD AT IVES FOR OWNERS OF CERTIFIED BROWN, K
 BARBER HAIR STYLING SCHOOLS ON THE STATE BOARD OF BARBERS
- SUMMARY: Provides for the replacement of one of the industry members on the Board of Barbers by an owner of a certified school of barbering.
