- SUMMARY: Repeals and replaces sections of the Municipal Public Employees Labor Relations Act on mediation and arbitration.
- 963 AN ACT TO NOTIFY UNEMPLOYED WORKERS Bustin LV/WD(acc.)
 OF THE AVAILABILITY OF OTHER FORMS
 OF ASSISTANCE
- SUMMARY: Commissioner of Health and Human Services shall provide the Bureau of Employment Security with information on all public assistance and income supplementation programs, with enough copies to be given to all claimants of unemployment benefits.
