SUMMARY: In order to cover the cost of PUC regulation, 35 MRSA §13-B requires payment of a filing fee of 2/100th of one percent of the estimated cost when a utility purchases capacity, energy or transmission capacity or applies for fuel conversion. This bill extends the filing fee concept to construction of generation or transmission facilities under §13-A.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-155) Allows for waivers, refunds and exemptions from filing fees when they are not needed to process the application.

SUMMARY: Makes filing fees under 35 MRSA §13-B correspond more nearly to the actual cost to the commission of reviewing an application for purchase of generating capacity, energy and transmission capacity by allowing a waiver of all or part of the filing fee and by requiring a refund of any unused portions. The PUC will include in its annual report to the Legislature under Title 35, section 17, a summary of filing fees received, waived or returned during the previous year, and a detailed list of expenditures of funds received from the filing fees in each particular case.

SUMMARY: The bill exempts radio paging services from PUC regulation.

Committee Amendment "A" (H-179) clarifies that radio paging is one-way communication. It requires any public utility involved in radio paging to keep separate books, but allows the PUC Commission to waive that requirement for good cause, for example a very small company.
