SUMMARY: Regulates the emissions of hexavalent chromium, a human respiratory carcinogen, through the establishment of ambient air quality standards and emissions standards for potential emitters of this pohitant.

SUMMARY: Revises the existing statutes dealing with the inspection, registration and abandonment of dams and the setting of water levels and to transfer the administration of these statutes from the Department of Agriculture Food & Rural Resources to the Department of Environmental Protection.

Enacted in New Draft as LD 1721 (PL 1983 c 458)

SUMMARY: In passing this bill, the Legislature decided that a policy concerning the future care and development of Maine's rivers and streams was necessary to strike a balance among the various, and sometimes conflicting, user of those waterways. In order to implement this policy the Legislature found it appropriate to:

prohibit the permitting or licensing of new dams on 1,051 miles

of 18 outstanding river segments;

amend the shoreland zoning statute's declaration of policy to acknowledge that certain river segments deserve special treatment because of their outstanding river resource values;

require demonstration that there are no better alternatives to proposed alterations before granting a permit on the 720 miles of listed river segments;

the establishment of river corridor commissions encourage responsible for creating and implementing a comprehensive plan of shoreland zoning on the State's rivers;

create one-stop hydropower project licensing, with developments, including appropriate to these consideration of its economic benefits:

create the Commission on Local Land Use Violations to review the use of the state's court system to resolve violations of land use Commission is to identify problems, evaluate alternative remedies and report to the Legislature during the 2nd Regular Session of the 111th.
