Office of Legislative Assistants State House, Station 13 Augusta, Maine 04333 (207) 289-2486 SUMMARY: ID 1427 intended to disclose the practices and attitudes of the Disability Determination Services within the Department of Human Services. The Disability Determination Services argued that DDS is required to use the Program Operation Manual System (POMS) which are more restrictive than the rules adopted in the Federal Register. As a result, administrative court judges overturn 60-70% of the DDS decisions.

Pine Tree Legal Association on the other hand indicated that while the different sets of rules are indeed a problem, the issue pertains also to medical decisions based on no substantiating evidence, a lack of sufficient and adequately trained personnel, and a negative attitude toward disability assistance applicants. Pine Tree Legal supported the proposal for a 12 member commission to investigate DDS.

In Congress, there are 2 bills designed to resolve the discrepancy between the two sets of rules. In addition, Massachusetts is conducting a study of the issue.
