

SUMMARY: The bill would have required school administrative units to allow military recruiters into their schools if they let any non-military recruiters in the school. On closer examination the problem only affected a small number of schools and the bill was withdrawn in favor of informal arrangements between the schools and recruiters.

SUMMARY: The bill would have required testing services to provide special time consideration to students with dyslexia. Since the SAT and College Board test already provide for extra time, the bill was given a leave to withdraw. The department is to promulgate rules requiring school administrative units to inform handicapped students their right to a time extension. The department will also make a rule requiring schools to inform a handicapped student's teachers about the student's handicap if it is specified in the student's IEP that teacher should be informed.

RESOLVE, AUTHORIZING THE 2019 OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE ASSISTANTS TO SURVEY THE AVAILABILITY OF VOCATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO HANDI-CAPPED STUDENTS

SUMMARY:

The resolve would have authorized the Office of Legislative Assistants to conduct a study of accessibility of vocational education programs to handicapped students. It was withdrawn in favor of a study directed by the Joint Standing Committee on

Education covering the same topic.
