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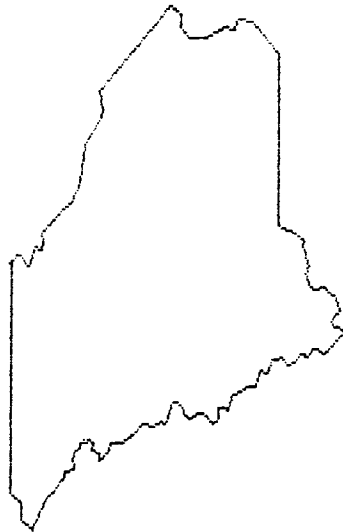

AN ACT RELATING TO THE PERIOD OF
LICENSE SUSPENSION FOR DRIVERS
CONVICTED OR ADJUDICATED OF
OPERATING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

SUMMARY: Amends the periods of suspension for drivers convicted or adjudicated of OUI to conform to or exceed the Federal criteria. Increases the penalties as follows:

1. Refusal to take test		
1st offense	180 days	Same
2nd offense w/in 6 yrs	180 + 90 days	1 year
2. Civil Infraction		
1st offense	45 days	45 days suspen- sion/45 days restricted
2nd offense w/in 6 yrs	(automatic criminal violation)	
3. Criminal Violation		
1st offense	90 days	Same
2nd offense w/in 6 yrs	90 + 90 days	1 year
