2090 AN ACT CONCERNING DESECRA- Baker TION AND VANDALISM OF RELIGIOUS AND OTHER INSTI-TUTIONS

PL 1983, c. 710

SUMMARY: The Maine Criminal Code addresses the crime of desecration of places of worship in the Revised Statutes, Title 17-A, section 507. This bill raised the classification of the crime from a Class E to a Class D crime.

SUMMARY: This bill sought to prohibit the following computer related crime:
 Unauthorized interference with intellectual property, unauthorized interference with computer equipment or supplies, and unauthorized interference with computer use. The bill was withdrawn in hopes that Criminal Law Advisory Committee would review the subject of computer related crimes.
