

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2127 AN ACT TO AMEND THE WAIT- McHenry
ING PERIOD BETWEEN RECORDING INTENTIONS OF
MARRIAGE AND RECEIPT OF
A MARRIAGE LICENSE

PL 1983, c. 686

SUMMARY: This bill changed the waiting period between filing of intentions to marry and issuance of a marriage license from 5 days to 3 days. It also permits Supreme Judicial Court justices and Superior Court justices, as well as District Court judges and Probate Court judges, to waive the waiting period.

2146 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL EXTRADITION ACT

SUMMARY: This bill is designed to simplify and streamline the criminal extradition process and to speed up the procedure by which fugitives are returned to sister states. It provides that technical defects in extradition paper work shall not prevent extradition unless the fugitive is prejudiced by the defect. It limits bail for a fugitive.

The bill also addresses several recurring technical problems in the extradition process and establishes an extradition account, funded by forfeited bail, to finance the return of fugitives to this State.
