2200 AN ACT TO AMEND THE CERTIFIED SEED POTATO LAW

OTP PL 1983, C. 727

SUMMARY: Changes the period of time in which seed potatoes can be certified from 4 generations to 5 generations.

2244 AN ACT TO CLARIFY RESPONSI-BILITY UNDER THE MAINE POTATO OUALITY CONTROL LAW OTP AM PL 1983, C. 780

SUMMARY: Clarifies the responsibility of Maine Potato Quality
Control Board to recommend actions to encourage participation in
the Maine Bag Program and it further stipulates several
considerations the Commissioner of Agriculture must entertain
before deciding the amount of the inspection fee to be assessed to
those participating potato growners.

2179 AN ACT TO INCREASE THE POTATO TAX

Lisnik

PL 1983, C. 766

SUMMARY: Increases the tax levied on potatoes grown in Maine from 2 1/2 cents per cwt to 5 cents per hundredweight. The tax increase initially will meet legal expenses incurred by the Maine Potato Council in its attempt to defend Maine potato growers against Canadian imports. Once those debts are discharged, increased revenue will continue to support the Maine Potato Council on the condition that an evaluation be conducted to study the advisability of consolidating the various industry groups representing the Maine Potato sector. A report will be submitted by January 1, 1986.

2295 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A POULTRY Lisnik
DISEASE CONTROL FUND

OTP PL 1983, C. 747

SUMMARY: Establishes a fund for the Commissioner of Agriculture to use to detect, prevent, control or eradicate any infections or contagious poultry disease within the State of Maine. The fund provides resources to eradicate and indemnify diseased poultry flocks immediately, and the Commissioner is authorized to receive funds for emergency purposes including assessments from owners of commercial poultry flocks.

2306 AN ACT TO AMEND THE ACT TO PRO- Wood
TECT THE PUBLIC FROM UNSAFE
PESTICIDE USE

OTP AM PL 1983, C. 761

SUMMARY: Creates the framework for addressing the problem of pesticide drift and requires the Pesticides Control board to propose rules regarding application procedures and tolerance levels for off-target residues by June 15, 1985.
