2203 AN ACT CONCERNING THE TRISTATE LOTTO COMPACT

SPONSOR Usher Violette Nadeau Jacques (Committee Report)
DISPOSITION
MAJ-OTP-A(ACC)
MIN-ONTP
PL 1983, c. /32

SUMMARY: LD 2203 along with Committee Amendment "A" enacts the Tri-State Lotto Compact in Maine, effective when at least 2 of the party states (Me., Vt., & N.H.) with a combined population of at least 2 million enact the compact. This effective date would only occur if both Maine & N.H. enact the compact. The larger participation on a multi-state level is predicted to net larger revenues, thus making large prizes possible to compete with the Mass. "Megabucks" game. Cash prizes are tax-exempt to winners. The compact will receive a sunset review 2 years after the effective date and again in 5 years.

2204 AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW RELAT- Pray OTP-ND
ING TO WINE FRANCHISES Baldacci ND of LD 1960
Zirnkilton PL 1983, c. 670

SUMMARY: This bill allows retail licensees to buy table and sparkling wines from a wholesaler whose territory does not normally cover that retailer if the retailer goes to the wholesale dealer's warehouse to make the purchase and pick up the wines.

2726 RESOLVE, REIMBURSING JEFFREY Curtis LV/WD
BELLMORE OF WALDOBORO FOR
DAMAGES CAUSED BY THE ACTIONS
OF A STATE WARD

SUMMARY: The bill appropriates \$2,500 to reimburse Bellmore for damages allegedly sustained to his motor vehicle when it was struck by a vehicle operated by a minor state ward. Bill was withdrawn when case was settled.

2228 AN ACT TO PROTECT TENANTS FROM Handy OTP-A
LACK OF HEAT Nadeau PL 1983, c. 764
Bost

SUMMARY: LD 2228 and Committee Amendment "A" make it a breach of the implied warranty of habitability if a landlord is obligated to provide heat and (a) the temperature is low enough to injure a tenant's health, (b) the heating facilities are incapable of maintaining a minimum temperature of 68 degrees, or (c) the heating facilities are not operated to protect the building from freezing. If the landlord does not comply, the tenant's purchase of heating fuel is deemed a cost of compliance and thus deductible from the rent.
