AND THE VALIDITY OF MOTOR

VEHICLE TITLES

SUMMARY: LD 2272 proposed to resolve a problem that confronts some motor vehicle dealers with respect to vehicles purchased at vehicle auctions. This bill proposed that any person who has purchased a vehicle which has been auctioned and which does not have a clear title or the mileage of the vehicle is misrepresented may rescind the sale within one year of purchase. The vehicle auctioneer would be liable for damages.

A Committee Amendment was proposed to include automobile dealers.

The bill was withdrawn on the condition that the Committee on Transportation study the issue.

SUMMARY: Authorizes the Department of Transportation to continue a study to determine the condition of older bridges, many of which are too small to qualify for federal assistance and are the responsibility of Maine towns. A report is expected by February 1, 1985 which will outline alternative long term strategies for improving and maintaining these structures.
