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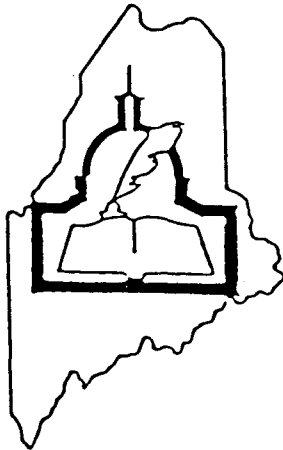

SUMMARY: LD 2349, unlike the original bill, LD 2115, proposed:

1. to vest administration and maintenance of surplus property with the state agency under which most recently holds title or jurisdiction over the property;
2. to authorize the State Budget Officer to send out forms with the budget requests to the various state agencies to be completed and returned by September 1, 1984. These forms would provide the basic data to determine the total inventory and value of real estate, the real estate that is surplus, and the location of all state property; and
3. to exclude highways, bridges, state parks, etc., from the survey.

LD 2349 also established the Office of Legislative Assistants as the staff agency for the Commission.

House Amendment "A", removed the staffing provision pertaining to the Office of Legislative Assistants and appropriated \$5,000 to the Department of Finance and Administration to compile the real property data.
