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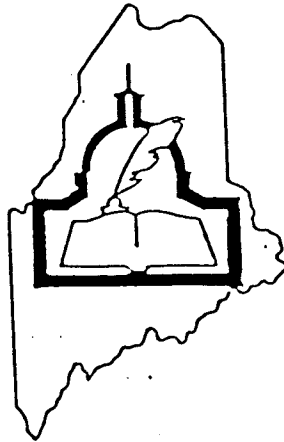

2419	AN ACT CONCERNING ENFORCE- MENT OF LAND USE LAWS		NOT ACCEPTED

SUMMARY: This majority Committee report on LD 2069 differed from the new draft LD 2418, which was accepted, primarily in two ways. This bill would have established a new Local-State Coordination Unit within the Department of Environmental Protection to assist municipalities in enforcement of land use laws. It would also have appropriated funds to the Attorney General's Office for one new attorney position within the Natural Resource Division.

2464	AN ACT TO REMOVE FEES AND PROVIDE FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CHEMICAL SUBSTANCE IDENTIFICATION LAW	Kany	Not accepted
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SUMMARY: This new draft, minority report B of LD 1977, (not accepted) would have restored the 1980 law, removing the fees and reporting requirements added in 1983. The emergency clause is retained.

2465	AN ACT TO REMOVE FEES AND PROVIDE FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CHEMICAL SUBSTANCE IDENTIFICATION LAW	Kany	Not accepted
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SUMMARY: This new draft, minority report C of LD 1977, (not accepted) is the same as LD 2464 except the emergency clause is dropped.
