SUMMARY:

LD 5 proposed that no changes to, improvements or construction on the State House and surrounding grounds can be undertaken unless the alterations, improvements, or construction are part of a plan that have been approved by the Legislature.

The legislation, in the emergency preamble, stated that the Legislature, under current provisions, is unable to exercise any control with respect to improvements or alterations made to the State House. This is particularly true with respect to immediate or soon-to-occur improvements and alterations.

There are two statutes that address this issue. Title 3 of the Maine Revised Statutes, section 162, sub-§12 provides that the Legislative Council has the authority to:

- A. insure adequate physical facilities are available for the efficient operation of the Legislature;
- B. provide for and determine the use of legislatively controlled facilities within and outside the State House; and
- C. assign use of all rooms in the State House, except the immediate offices of the Governor, for chairpersons of legislative committees and legislative staff.

In 5 MRSA §1742, sub-§§15 and 18, the Department of Finance and Administration, through the Bureau of Public Improvements, is authorized to:

- A. possess general supervision of the State House and surrounding grounds;
- B. make repairs and alterations connected with the State House and surrounding grounds; and
- C. to assign rooms in <u>all</u> buildings used by the State for offices and determine the occupancy thereof.

The bill was withdrawn at the request of the sponsors who believe that the Legislature has the necessary authority over the use and operation of the State House and grounds.
