SUMMARY:

On July 1, 1976, employees of the Superior Court became state employees and part of the Maine State Retirement System. Prior to that date they were county employees and part of the county retirement system. On retirement they receive two pensions, one based on their time and rate of pay as county employees and one based on their time and rate of pay as state employees. The bill would have transferred their county retirement to the State Retirement System. This would have allowed the employee to combine the two time periods and receive a pension at their higher state employee rate of pay. The additional cost of the pensions would have been credited to the counties.

Two House Amendments (HA-H50, HB-H51) which were not adopted exempted Knox County and credited the costs to the General Fund.

A third House Amendment (HC-H-52) made the provisions of the original bill effective only if the commissioners of a county elect to adopt them. A Senate Amendment (HC-S-39) corrected certain technical errors.
