#### SUMMARY:

LD:

The original bill established a special fund to support various river conservation activities. The committee amended the bill (CAH-12) to specify the uses of the fund. These include assistance to local governments, river conservation groups or landowners for the aquisition, development and maintenance of river access and related facilities. Conservation easements, fisheries management, and recreation management are also authorized uses of the fund. Revenues from the fund are expected to come from donations, gifts and from the sale of promotional items (such as canoe decals).

The committee further specified that the fund would be subject to legislative allocation.

Floor amendments removed the emergency preamble (S-37) and added an allocation for FY '86 and '87 (H-26). Removal of the emergency clause became necessary when a controversy arose over the propriety of state employees soliciting donations to such a fund. Proponents of the bill argued that there are many examples of voluntary financial contributions from the private sector to support government activities ("chickadee checkoff," forestry research, port development). Opponents argued that the legislature should impose a tax to raise revenue it intended to spend and not allow state employees to solicit contributions.
