SUMMARY:

This bill would have required substitute teachers employed by a school administrative unit for more than 2 days in a school year to be certified and would have raised their minimum daily pay from \$30 to \$50.

This bill was approved as a carryover bill.

SUMMARY:

This bill would have required decisions on the eligibility of students to be made, at the request of the student, in a public meeting following notice and opportunity for public participation and would have allowed a decision on a student's eligibility for interscholastic activities to be appealed to the State Board of Education.

SUMMARY:

The cost of purchasing school buses are allowable costs under the School Finance Act. However, there is a limit of \$4 million on the amount of bus purchases that can be subsidized through the School Finance Act in any one year. This bill would have increased the limit to \$6 million. This would have increased the state's share by \$1.1 million starting in 1986-87. The amendments added a fiscal note and an appropriations section. The bill initially passed both houses but was not funded.
