SUMMARY:

ND:

The bill orders PUC to conduct a formal public hearing to determine the justness and reasonableness of mandatory local measured service, including: costs and savings to all classes of customers and the telephone company and the effects of LMS on customers. The PUC order initiating LMS is nullified, and LMS is prohibited until July 1, 1986. Any new PUC order would be based on the investigation. At least 12 months of parallel billing is required before any LMS order.

This is one of nine bills withdrawn in favor of committee

and PUC study. (See LD1011).

SUMMARY:

ND:

The bill increases the annual assessment on utilities to fund the PUC Regulatory Fund by \$300,000 for FY 85-86, making a total of \$1,894,000 per year and by \$45,000 more beginning in FY 86-87 making a total of \$1,939,000 per year. The bill retains present law which divides the assessment among the utilities in proportion to their intrastate gross operating revenues and has an upper limit of 1/4 of one percent of those revenues.

The bill exempts gas utilities subject only to the safety jurisdiction of PUC pending study. It allows PUC to correct errors in assessments the following year. It permanently establishes 2 positions for seasonal legal researchers; positions which are now established year to year.

The bill also streamlines the assessment language and corrects an error in the number of authorized positions.

The Committee amendment (H-67) makes it clear that no full-time positions are to be added at the PUC, but 2 part-time (i.e. up to 15 weeks per year) positions are to be established on a permanent basis.
