AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE TERM 'AUTHORIZED

PERSON' UNDER THE LAW RELATING TO DEATHS AND

26 BURIALS

SUMMARY:

This bill defines who is an "authorized person" who may obtain permits needed to dispose of a dead human body. LD 26 would have allowed permits to be obtained by a member of the deceased's family, a person authorized by the deceased or a family member or with an indigent, by the municipal officers. LD 651 allows permits to be obtained by a family member, a person authorized by a family member if no family member wishes to assume that responsibility or in the absence of family, a person authorized by the deceased. This bill makes only one change in current law; currently a family member can authorize a nonfamily member only if no family member is "physically or mentally capable of the responsibility."

SUMMARY:

In order to self-insure, a municipality must estimate its net worth. Because this is difficult in most cases, the bill proposed to substitute a municipality's bond rating for net worth as a more measurable indication of a municipality's financial security. The bill was withdrawn because the Bureau of Insurance and the Maine Municipal Association could not agree on a recommendation for a suitable new measure.
