SUMMARY:

This resolve established a commission, comprised mostly of disabled persons, to study independent living opportunities and services to disabled persons in Maine. Independent living, in this context, includes such concepts as self-determination, self-help, deinstitutionalization, and barrier-free access. The commission must report to the 2d Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.

The committee amendment (S-110) reduced the appropriation from \$50,000 to \$17,700 and added consideration of private sector involvement in independent living and private-public partnerships to provide rehabilitative services.

The house amendment (H-232) to the committee amendment reduced the appropriation from \$17,700 to \$9,800.
