SUMMARY:

This bill would have provided a mechanism in statute by which a long-term drug treatment center and a school administrative unit in which the facility is located may reach agreement to provide educational services to students residing at the center for which the school unit will receive reimbursement from the State for the cost of educating those students.

SA-S-86: The bill was substantially reworked in committee, rereferred to the Joint Standing Committee on Alcoholism Services for funding and subsequently amended on the floor of the Senate. The Senate amendment reflected the Education Committee's revision of the bill. The amendment added an emergency clause and established a pilot project for one year between the Day One Treatment Center and SAD 6. The commissioner is to report his recommendations on the project to the Education and Alcoholism Committee by February 15, 1986.
