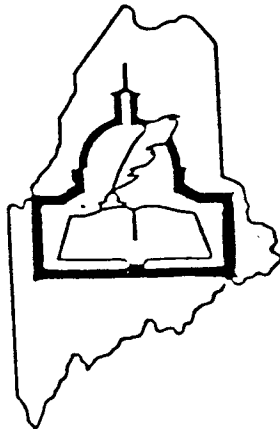

SUMMARY:

This bill provides for the registration of all-terrain vehicles under the snowmobile law in the Revised Statutes, Title 12. All-terrain vehicles are established as a separate type of vehicle which is subject to the same provisions of the law as snowmobiles. All-terrain vehicles are subject to a registration fee, the proceeds of which are distributed in the same manner as proceeds from snowmobile registration fees. All-terrain vehicles are subject to the same prohibition as snowmobiles. In order to travel on trails on private property, operators of all-terrain vehicles are required to obtain the landowners permission.

Committee Amendment A strikes out the original bill in its entirety. The purpose of this amendment is to provide for safety education on the operation of all-terrain vehicles and for a study of the recreational and safety needs of all-terrain vehicles and the conflicts arising from their use. The cost of this study is \$20,000. A major portion of that is for compensation of a project leader who must be added to the bureau for the life of the project.

The registration fee is increased from \$5 to \$7 in the amendment to fund the education program. The original draft increased the fee to \$11.25.

SUMMARY:

The purpose of this bill is to provide that a person stationed on a military installation, who registers a snowmobile, shall be considered a resident of the municipality in which the installation is located for the purposes of distributing the snowmobile registration fees paid by the person.
