SUMMARY:

The bill repeals an unallocated section of a bill passed in the 110th Legislature which required a report by the Commissioner (DMR) on the use of funds from a license increase. The unallocated section was amended in the 111th Legislature to extend the reporting date. The section stipulated that if the report was not made that the license fee sections throughout the marine resources laws would be repealed. The Commissioner has reported and the committee approved the bill to avoid future confusion.

SUMMARY :

The bill proposed a comprehensive lobster trap limit and limited entry program for the lobster industry. The bill also incorporated provisions for the harvest of oversize, offshore lobsters, lobster hatcheries, a harvest season, trawl limits, time-of-day limits on lobstering and an apprentice program. There was little support for the bill at its hearing. The majority of the committee felt that conditions did not warrant the sweeping actions contained in the bill.

SUMMARY :

The original bill proposed license fee increases of 200%. The majority of the committee recommended a 100% increase (CAH-237). The bill was amended on the floor (H-294) to reduce the lobster license, commercial fishing license and scallop license fee increases to \$20. The bill was further amended (H-360) to attach a specific appropriation of the new revenues; primarily to enforcement activities.
