SUMMARY:

ND:

Subsections 1-4 of the bill simply re-enact existing law, which provides a 70% rate reduction for instrastate toll calls from deaf, hearing-impaired, and speech-impaired persons, and which also provides a special equipment fund. New subsection 5 extends the 70% rate reduction to any local measured service for deaf, etc.. New subsection 6 extends the 70% reduction to volunteers, nonprofit and government organizations which serve the deaf, etc., if over half the calls from the phone in question are on behalf of deaf, hearing impaired and speech impaired persons.

The Committee amendment (S-141) would have added an appropriation of \$10,000 in FY86 and \$15,000 in FY87, but the

bill failed to receive an appropriation.

SUMMARY:

The bill prohibits local measured telephone service for social service organizations which provide emergency services and for satellite telephone lines operated by volunteers for such organizations.

This is one of nine bills withdrawn in favor of committee

and PUC study. (See LD1011).
